Construction and operation of a MOX fuel fabrication facility is subject to the Commission's requirements set forth in 10 C.F.R. Part 70. The hearing procedures set forth in 10 C.F.R. Part 2, Subpart L are generally applicable to the adjudication of matters related to the issuance of 10 C.F.R. Part 70 licenses. Nevertheless, the Commission has decided that, in this instance, while any hearing conducted with respect to the potential licensing of a MOX fuel fabrication facility would be conducted as a Subpart L proceeding, certain other procedures not normally used in Subpart L will be used. These additional procedures will include a requirement for identification of contentions, the availability of limited discovery procedures, and the option for oral questioning of expert witnesses by the Presiding Officer based on questions submitted by the parties. Further information regarding the procedures to be used and scheduling are set forth in the enclosed notice of opportunity for hearing published in the *Federal Register* on April 18, 2001 (pages 19994-19996).
