Subject: Request for Information; Status of Program Bankruptcy and Decommissioning

Discussion: Mr. Holliday was contacted to ask the status of the licensed program as the licensee had filed for bankruptcy. Mr. Holliday stated that the licensed material is no longer being used for the business and that the trustee of the bankruptcy was working to find another licensed entity willing to accept ownership of the licensed materials (portable moisture-density gauges) and to transfer the remaining gauges to that licensee. Mr. Holliday was informed that if licensed activities had ceased principal activities under the license, it is required that the licensee notify the NRC in accordance with 10 CFR 30.36(d) and that the licensee then has 24 months to complete the decommissioning. Mr. Holliday was asked to send a letter stating the status of the licensed program and to notify the NRC that principal activities had ceased in accordance with 30.36(d). Mr. Holliday was reminded that the bankruptcy filing does not relieve Engineering & Testing, Inc., of its obligations to comply with NRC requirements, including those relating to security and control of licensed material; decontamination and decommissioning of any contaminated facilities; and the retention of personnel required by NRC requirements [e.g., the Radiation Safety Officer (RSO), authorized users, etc.]. Additionally, the license conditions and the license remain in full effect even beyond the stated expiration date of the license, until the license is terminated in writing by NRC. Mr. Holliday said that the company is no longer in operation and that he will provide a letter stating the licensee has ceased principal activities. He stated that they still have four PNG's that are inoperable and that they are having difficulties finding a viable disposal option with their limited resources. He said the manufacturer will accept them, but that there is a fee and the company has no resources to pay the fee. I informed him about the CRCPD's involvement in providing assistance to possessors with limited resources.
