To whom it may concern:

Aside from the already troubling history that exists under the current ownership of the FitzPatrick facility in New York, which I believe includes a recent acknowledgement of a 4-year-old radioactive waste leak that has never been remedied or remediaded, apparently now the NRC et al., is seeking comments from the public regarding this sale/transfer to another company with not just a troubling history, but one that will someday be regarded as the worst of the worst, and that company is Exelon.

Exelon is an irresponsible, dangerous and criminal company with dark intent, and in this attempt to monopolize taxpayer subsidies and demand that taxpayers pay for a singular energy source via the citizens of NY, and ultimately the rest of the country, makes this facility even more dangerous than it already is. Please do not approve this transfer and sale.

Exelon does not need a taxpayer bailout, they are now apparently a fortune 100 company, and the current CEO of Exelon is one of the most compensated among his class of citizen. The other liked to keep ancient and likely looted artifacts from Egypt in the corporate office.

Exelon does not need to purchase this decrepit and failing facility to try and prop up and waive nuclear power around as the savior of climate change. It's statistically ridiculous and statistically likely in less than one years time, if this sale is approved, that Exelon will be putting its hand out for more money to cover the costs of radioactive waste storage at the site, and how convenient that the sale now includes a little bonus spending cash for Exelon to keep the waste on site, even though they never pay a dime for illegally and criminally disposing of and incinerating it in places like Canon City, Colorado and St. Louis, Missouri, will certainly be asking for more money to repair the crumbling infrastructure, for rate increases, and probably more BS lawsuits about onsite waste storage that seems to reward the company for being really bad at its job, and the NRC for allowing it to get this far in the first place.

As well, I believe the Securities and Exchange Commission and the Department of Justice have an obligation to the public at this time to publicly acknowledge and investigate the NY subsidy for nuclear power that apparently will only benefit Exelon if this sale is approved, and the blatant market manipulation scheme that has been presented as a necessary evil of nuclear power bent climate change frauds, and the notion that nuclear power does not leave a carbon footprint.

Most importantly however, is how the uranium industry, most notably the company Energy Fuels, through several mergers, transitions, acquisitions, etc., have manipulated the spot price of uranium, and are now entered into a contract with, wouldn't you know it, Exelon, to provide fuel for the Exelon reactors at prices 63% higher than the going market rate.

An article written by Keith Goldberg on January 5, 2015, states that Energy Fuels, upon purchasing Uranerz, and Uranerz's contacts, through the contacted customer Exelon, the

largest operator of nuclear power in the USA, would allow Energy Fuels to "be able to better weather a current environment with low uranium prices, and expects to have a total of six uranium supply contacts with terms extended into 2020. In 2015 alone these contacts require approximately 1 million pounds of uranium to be delivered at an average price of \$58 per pound, 63 percent higher than the current spot uranium price of 35.50 per pound".

And wouldn't you know it, on September 12, 2016, Energy Fuels made a note to investors, regarding their operations update and uranium output expectations for 2016-2017, that 65% of the company's 2016 and 2017 production is contracted "well above" market prices for both years. How is this legal? This flies in the face of reason when the taxpayer of NY is now paying for these sales, and the 10 billion in taxpayers subsidies that only directly benefit 1 company, Exelon, is astounding. This company Exelon is able to manipulate the entire nuclear power market to its will. Quite frankly, its unbelievable. And shameful.

Since Exelon is the same company that has contracted with Energy Fuels to pay 63% more than the going market rate for uranium to provide fuel for the nuclear reactors that now need to be bailed out in NY, can a logical human explain how such blatant market fraud goes unchecked by the NRC, the SEC, the DOJ, the NNSA, and the FEC, if Exelon has been lobbying the hell out of elected officials too get these deals done and the taxpayer is really paying for an unchecked and bloated uranium fuel contact Exelon entered in with Energy Fuels? This is ridiculous. Where is the line drawn? When is a taxpayer ever willing to pay 63% more than the average rate of anything? Never. That's when. Because it's ridiculous.

It seems the NY taxpayer is on the hook for really bad business deals, and part of the subsidy the NY taxpayer is paying for is a market price for uranium that is 63% higher than the average market rate. Please someone with some sense and some authority do something! NY taxpayers are paying for blatant market fraud and this sale should be denied with haste as it certainly plays a role in the manipulation of Exelon's bottom line, and falsely inflates the worth of uranium in the free market. The uranium is not worth anything. The contracts for the uranium are worth something. Apparently the NY PUC forget to mention this to the citizens, and the NRC should be aware of these facts. Exelon should not be allowed to purchase this facility. There are too much of a monopoly already, and they operate as a criminal organization.

On a personal note, I have been communicating with the NRC for some time regarding the criminal nuclear waste situation in Canon City, Colorado, and its well-documented connection to Exelon, the same company that wants to be given final approval for this sale, and continues to flagrantly manipulate the uranium market, I am now more determined than ever to hold any and all of my federal agencies accountable for fraud and misconduct and I will be seeking legal representation demanding that any and all individuals who have a duty to the law and the citizens of the USA ad public servants, who have knowingly dismissed criminal acts and documentation of these criminal acts, be held accountable by the FBI and Congress, through my attorney. I've had enough of the plausible deniability.

Additionally, it's also statistically likely within 1 years time all the information I have about Exelon, the information that has never been made public in any capacity, but held in trust with a few individuals that really matter and know what they are doing, will shut this industry down once and for all, and I'm certain the old saying, "you break it, you buy it", will ring true here. This is a broke down facility the current owners were willing to walk away from. You should be too NRC. Don't let Exelon monopolize this conversation or the lives New Yorkers any

more than they already have. Please refuse this sale on the grounds that the facility is beyond repair, or in the very least, make sure Exelon cannot ask the taxpayers to pay for their poor business practices or any repairs to a facility they should know better than to try and purchase in the first place.
