As stated in our letter to your tribe dated November 20, 2015, the NRC is conducting Section 106 consultations in compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) through the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), as outlined in 36 CFR 800.8(c). The NRC staff's preliminary determination is that no historic properties would be affected by this undertaking. As discussed in the draft EIS, this conclusion is based upon 1) the environmental report submitted by NWMI; 2) NRC's environmental audit of the proposed site and independent analysis and review of historic and archaeological records; 3) consultation with Federal, State, Tribal and local agencies; and 4) consideration of public comments received during the scoping process.
