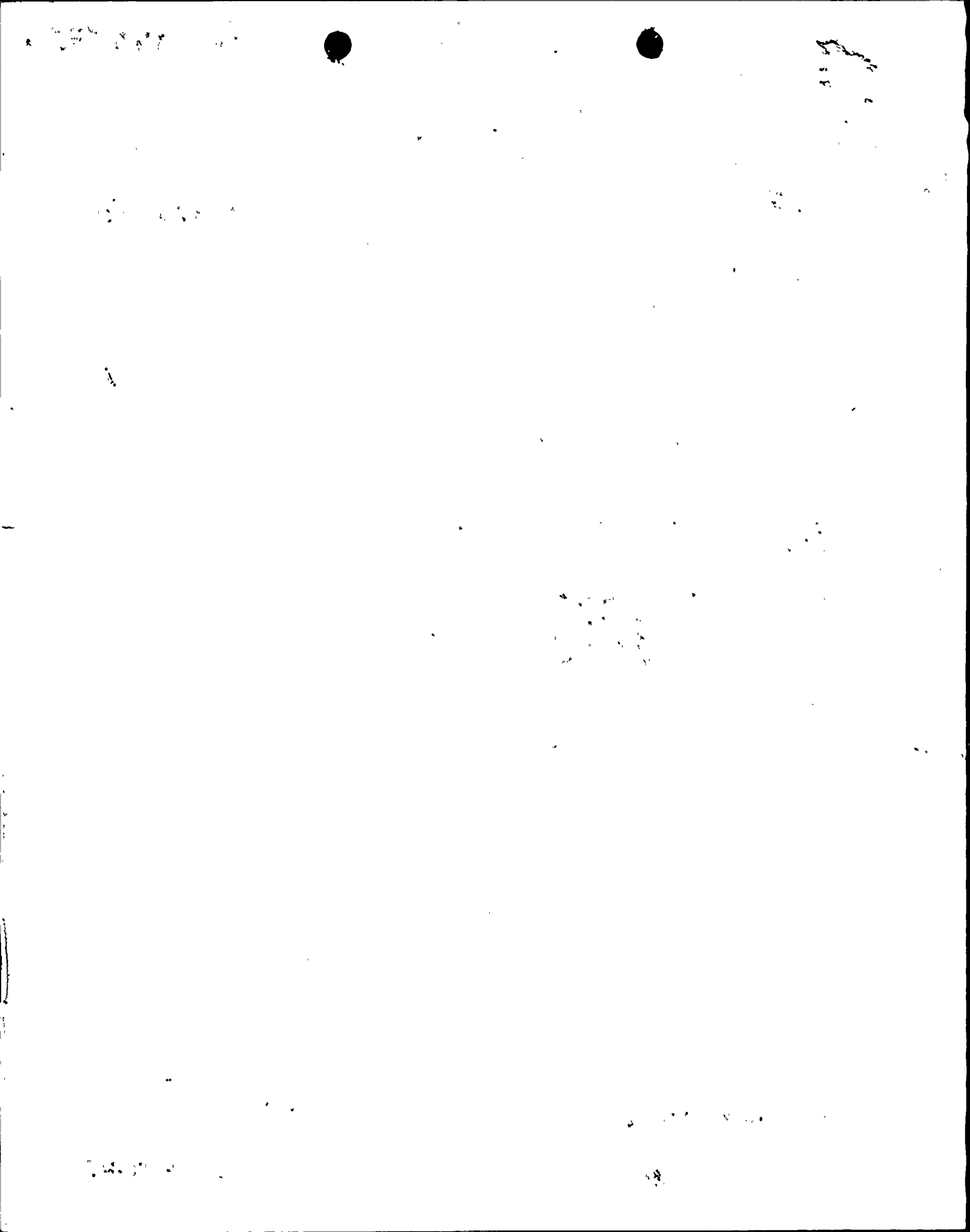

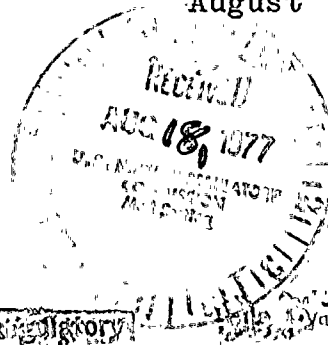

Gentlemen:

Since the State of California voted in favor of continuing the generation of electricity by nuclear energy (Proposition 15) attempts should have been made to at least have a hearing on Pacific Gas & Electric Company's request for an interim license to operate its Diablo Canyon nuclear unit. Without the use of this new nuclear unit, the entire State of California's 1977 peak load was in jeopardy.

Pacific Gas & Electric's request for this interim license was initiated in late Spring, but the hearing was set for October to satisfy the desires of a small minority group which opposes the operation of the Diablo Canyon plant. After all, we are a democracy, and the will of the majority should be given consideration. Setting the October hearing date, after the peak demand for electricity, completely disregarded the needs of the State. Further, with proper and unbiased action, the Diablo Canyon unit could have been in operation more than three years ago.

The output of the Diablo Canyon unit is badly needed by the State of California. Please use your influence to allow this facility to be placed in operation.
