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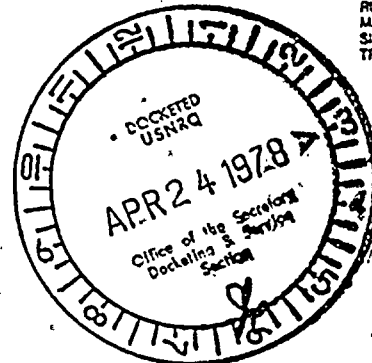

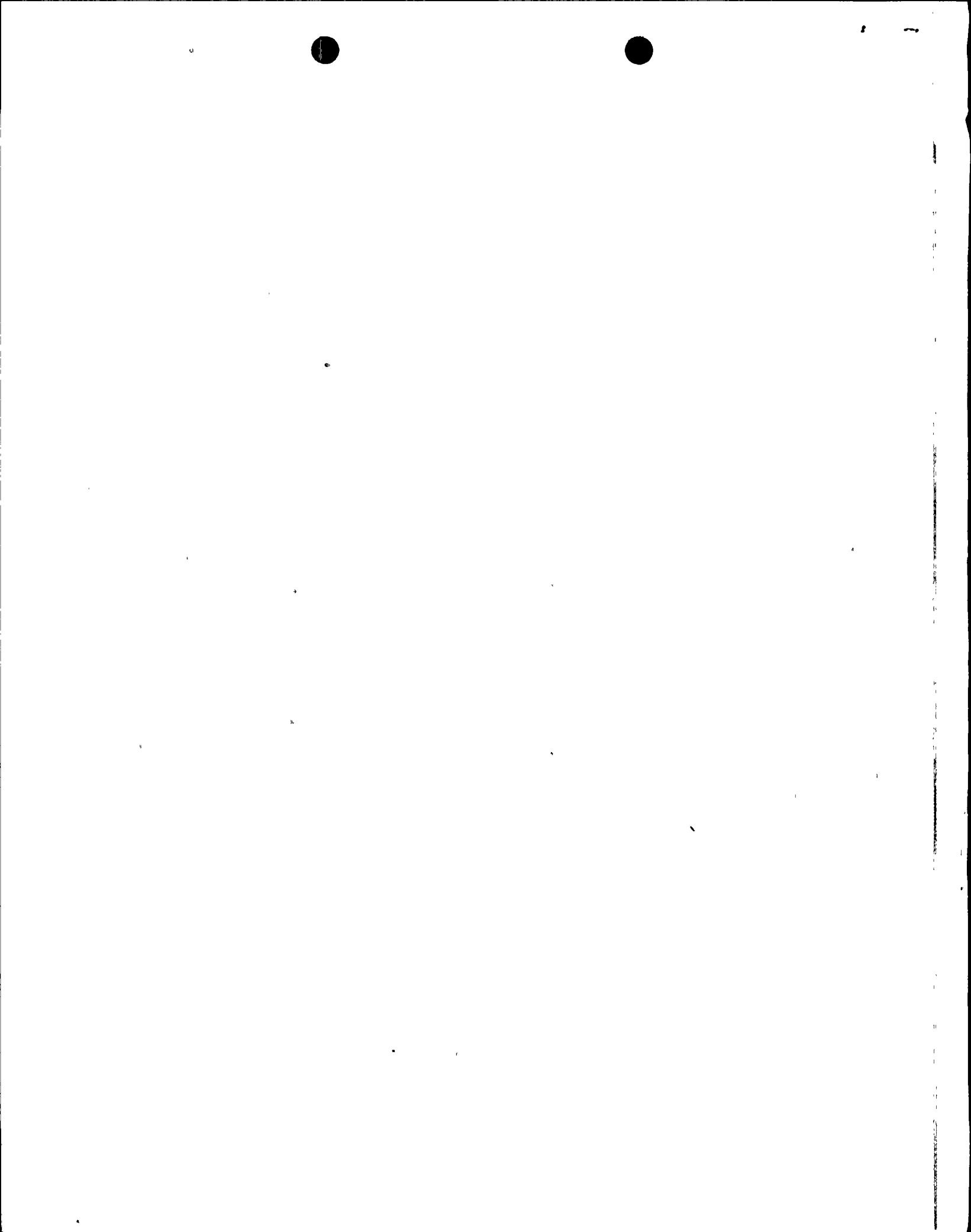
Dear Mr. Crane:

I write concerning the April 16, 1978 tour of the Diablo Canyon nuclear facility given the members of the San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace.

As we discussed last month by telephone, a group of the San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace desires to be given a tour of the facility comparable to the tours currently being provided to certain invited members of the public such as classes of students and members of farm associations. It was our understanding, which you expressly confirmed, that such groups are presently being given tours of the interior of the facility. You advised me that such a tour could be arranged for the interested members of the Mothers for Peace, and I, as you requested, provided you with the names, addresses and social security numbers of the interested individuals (see attached list.)

Per your instructions, approximately eleven members of the Mothers for Peace assembled at the site at 10:00 a.m. on April 16, 1978 for their scheduled tour of the facility. Unfortunately, however, there appears to have been a misunderstanding because rather than being given a tour of the nature we had specifically discussed (one that includes portions of the interior of the plant currently being made accessible to groups of students, etc.), the Mothers for Peace were simply escorted to a vantage point wherefrom they could view the facility at a distance and then were requested to leave.

Since it remains our understanding that members of the public such as student groups are currently (as late as Friday, April 14 and Monday, April 17, 1978) being given tours of the interior of the facility, presumably as part of a public relations program, we hereby renew the request on the part of the previously listed members of the Mothers for Peace to be included in a comparable tour. We can think of

no legitimate reason why concerned citizen groups such as the Mothers for Peace should not be allowed to view the interior of the facility in its present state to the extent that other invited members of the public are encouraged to do so.

The Mothers for Peace have advised me that if there remains any question about the nature of the tour they desire, I should refer you to the tour which they were given in 1976. The Mothers for Peace desire to be given a tour of the facility comparable to the one they were given at that time, which included a tour of areas such as the containment building, turbine building, control room, new fuel storage building, and the Rad waste condensor.

The interested members of the Mothers for Peace have suggested two dates in the near future: Sunday, May 7, 1978 and Sunday, May 14, 1978, on which they could attend the above described tour. They have requested that this time they be given a written itinerary in advance of the scheduled tour. I hope that one of the suggested dates is acceptable to you, and would appreciate your cooperation in arranging for this matter.

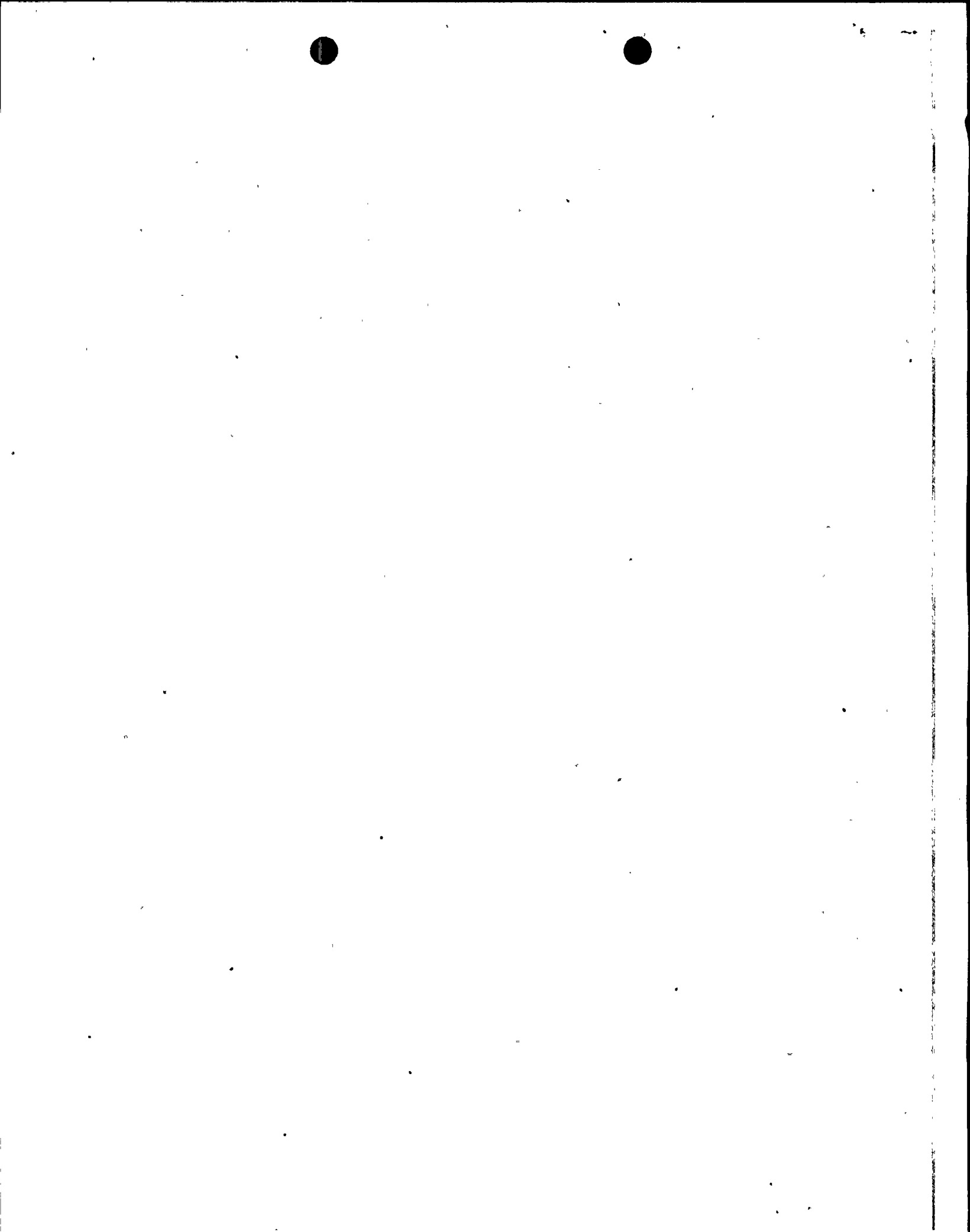

A survey has been made to determine the number of documents responsive to the document request. No personnel are presently available to perform the work required to comply with the request. PGandE is in the process of hiring and training eight clerks to perform the necessary work and estimates that the work can be completed no later than June 1, 1978. PGandE will file a formal response to the document request when the work has been completed and the documents are available for inspection.

either intends to call to testify on the Security Plan in this proceeding, or who has participated in the preparation of this plan.

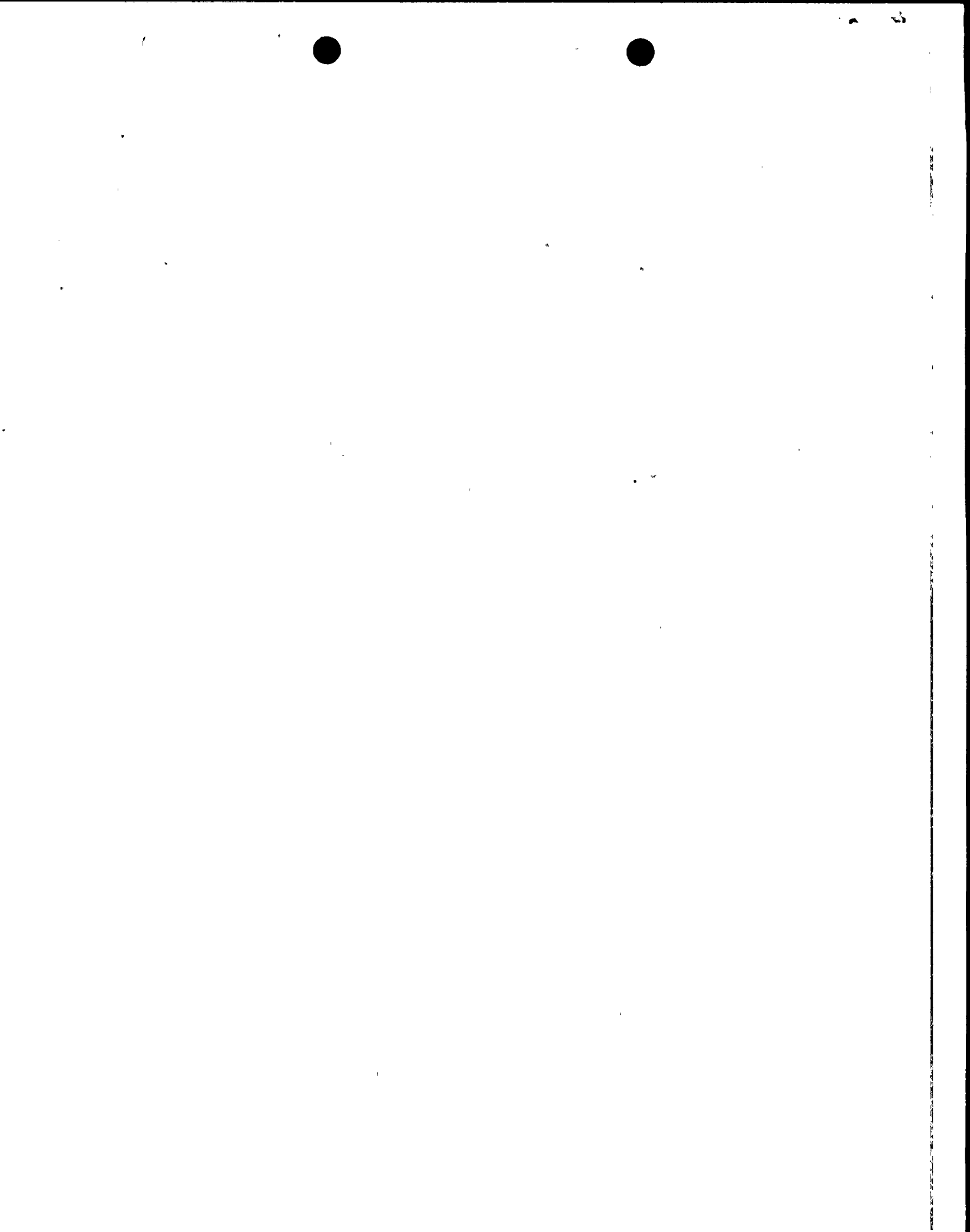

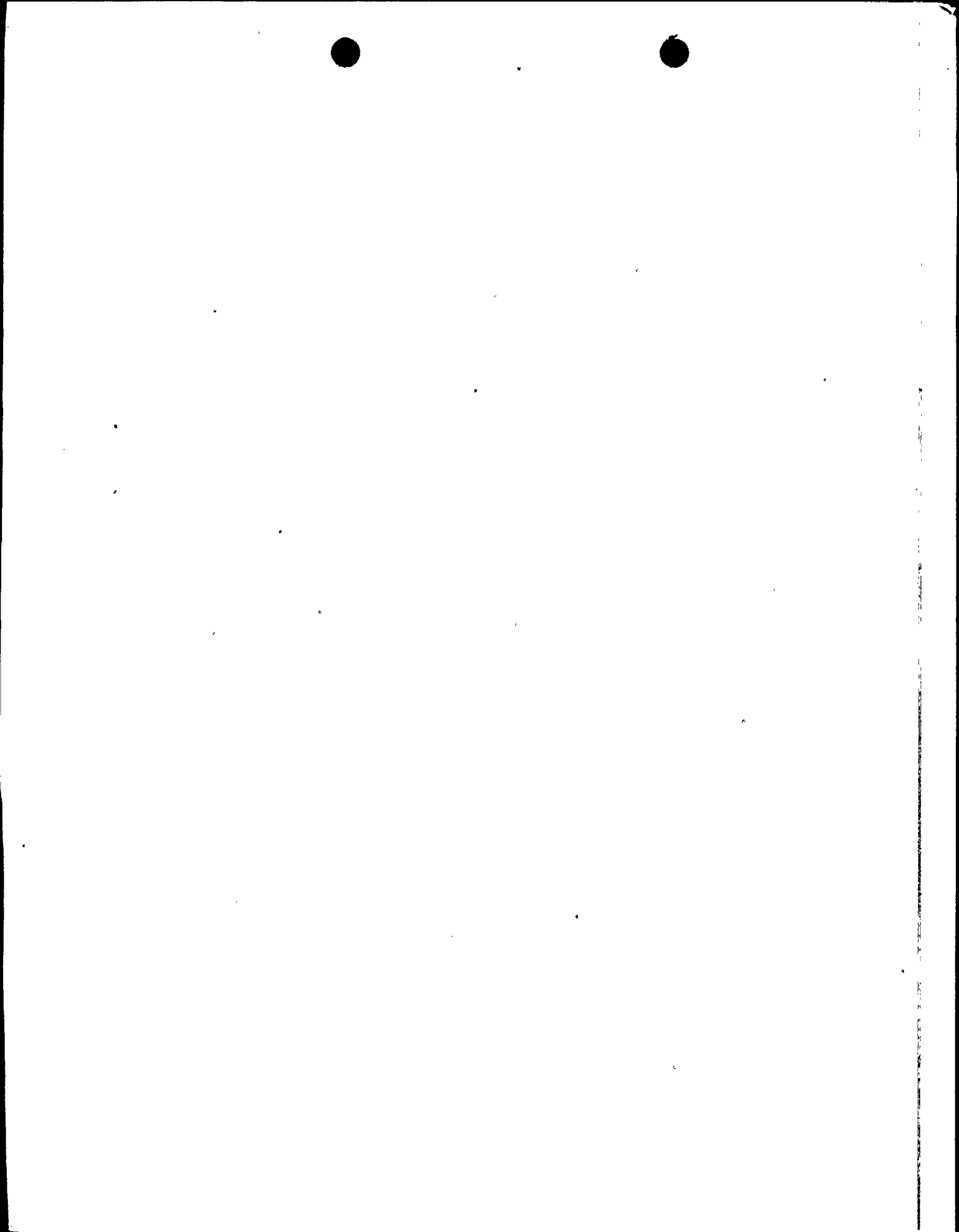
Our letter dated February 21, 1978 described the seismic scram instrumentation which we are purchasing. The letter inadvertently failed to describe the standards to which the system will be built and installed. It will be qualified seismically in accordance with IEEE-344-1975 and will be installed in accordance with IEEE-279-1971 in locations which are not subject to adverse environments, and therefore will meet the intent of IEEE-323-1974.

Our previous letter stated that the seismic scram system would be connected directly to the shunt coils on the reactor trip switchgear. This arrangement isolates the seismic scram system from the reactor protection system. Therefore, the only possible consequence of a seismic scram system malfunction would be a reactor trip.

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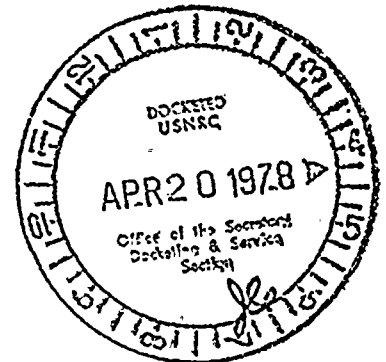

This letter is to clarify two statements in our letter dated March 22, 1978, regarding steam generator feedwater nozzle to pipe welds. Please refer to page 3 of the March 22, 1978 letter. The words "consumable ring" in line 6 and "consumable insert" in line 11 should be changed to "filler material".

Our piping contractor, Pullman Power Products, was unable to procure E-70S-6 insert rings. Therefore, the welding procedure has been qualified as a "K-weld", which is a groove bevel and a land which fits up with "0" gap. The root bead is made by fusing the lands with the GTAW process and adding E-70S-6 filler material as required.

Your Mr. L. Vorderbrueggen is aware that this clarification letter is forthcoming.
