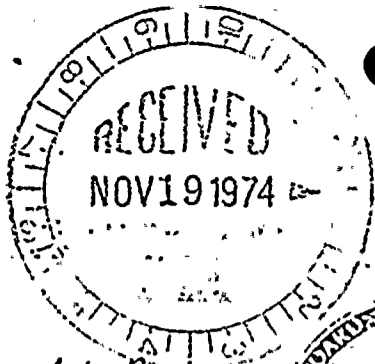

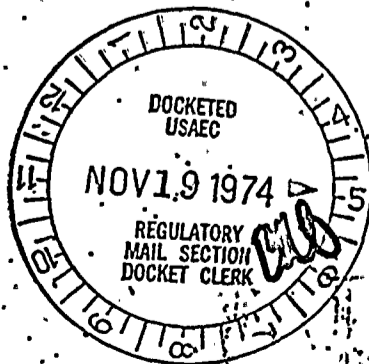
Statement: Supervisor Howard Mankins

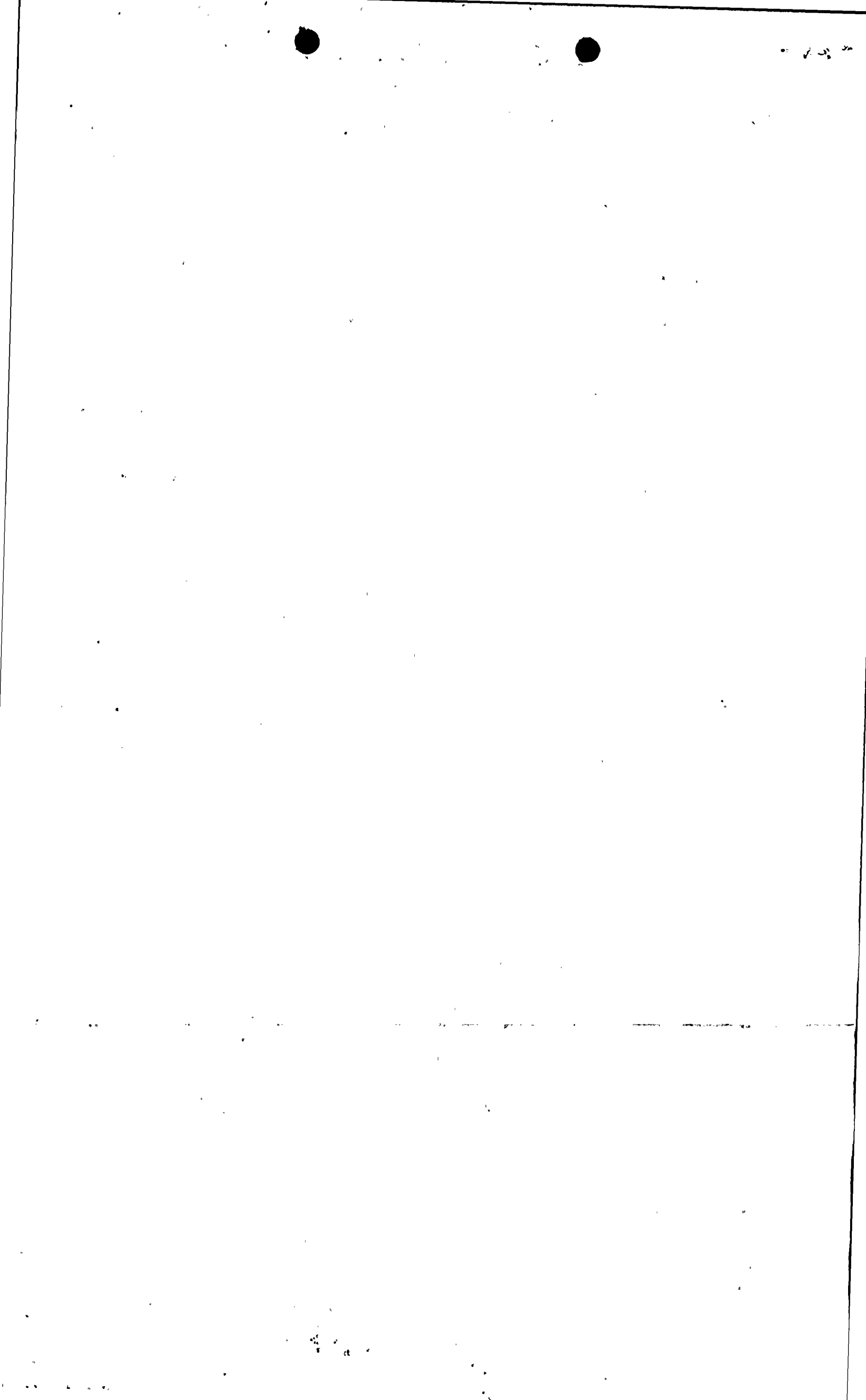
Today, Supervisor Howard Mankins introduced a resolution, at the Board of Supervisors regular Monday meeting, showing a great deal of concern for the Labor dispute at the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant, and recommending immediate conclusion of negotiations for continuation of its construction.

With the situation that the Nation faces today, Supervisor Mankins said the communities in San Luis Obispo County could be spared the added ills of the Nation by resolving this Labor dispute and maintaining the economic level of every day living in this County, by not contributing to large numbers of people becoming unemployed, due to Labor disputes.

The construction of this plant has had a very important economic impact upon the various communities within our County, and the continuation of Labor disputes is only adding to the hardship of local citizens.

RESOLUTION URGING THE DIABLO CANYON NUCLEAR POWER PLANT LABOR
DISPUTE BE RESOLVED.

The following resolution is now offered and read:

WHEREAS, labor contract disputes have halted construction
at the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant since early July, 1974; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1800 construction employees have been
off work in San Luis Obispo County for four months; and

WHEREAS, the payroll for these employees amounts to approxi-
mately \$3,400,000.00 dollars per month; and

WHEREAS, the impact on the local and regional economy due to
this loss of purchasing power is adding to economic distress; and

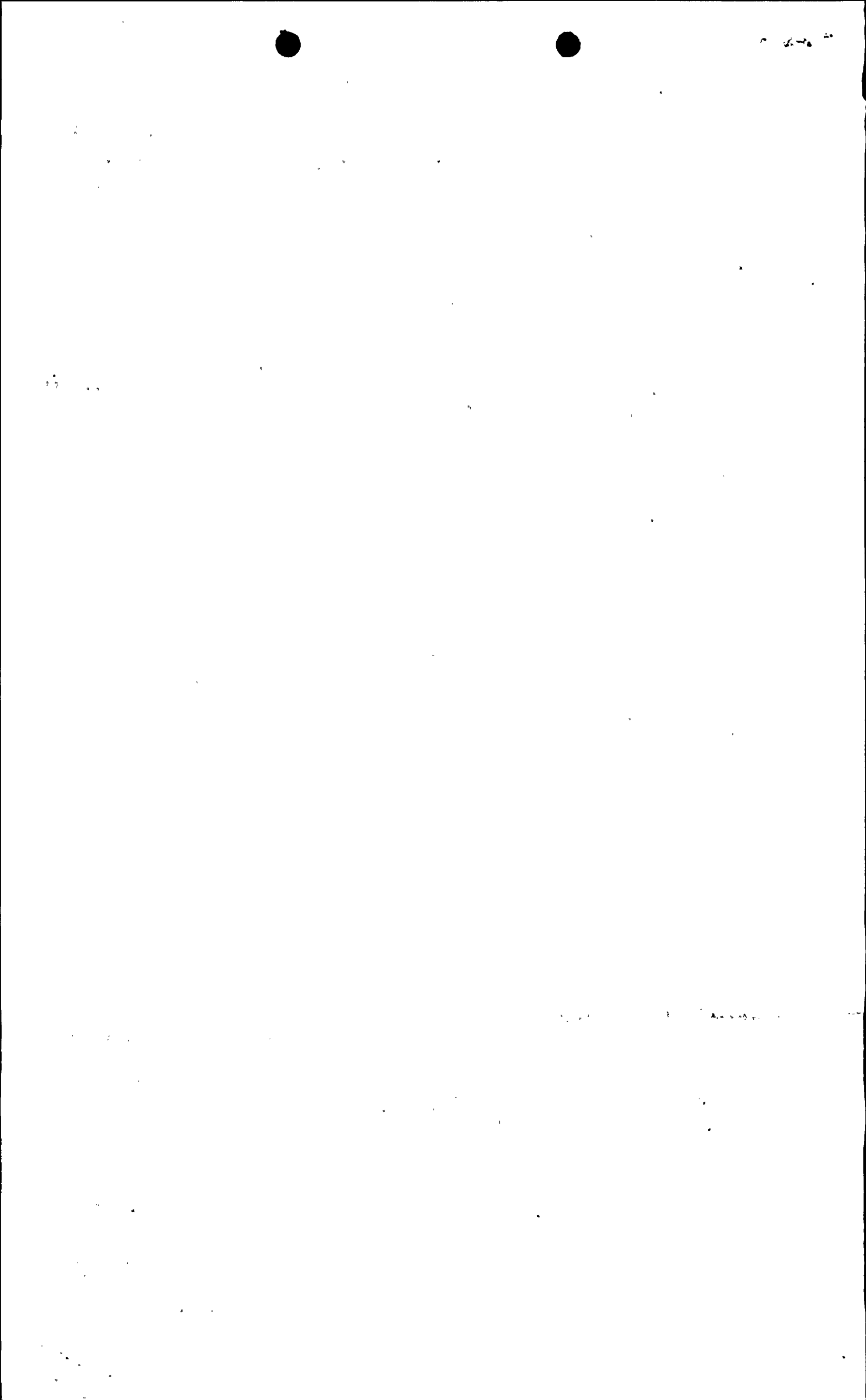
WHEREAS, each month delay in the completion of the Diablo
Canyon Power Plant requires consumption of an additional two million
barrels of oil per month for electric generation; and

WHEREAS, the delay in completion of the project is costly to
all consumers of electric power in San Luis Obispo County; and

WHEREAS, the long construction delay is also causing con-
struction employees and their families to relocate, thus creating
social and economic distress.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors
for San Luis Obispo County strongly urges and recommends that all
parties immediately expedite negotiations to resolve the labor
disputes and resume construction of the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power
Plant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that a copy of this
Resolution be sent all parties to the labor disputes.
