

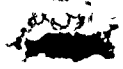

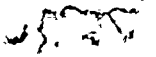
NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF APPLICANT'S

Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and the Atomic Energy Commission's regulations set forth in Appendix D to 10 CFR Part 50, notice is hereby given that documents entitled "Applicant's Environmental Report and Supplement No. 1 through Supplement No. 3 to Environmental Report" (collectively known as the "reports"), submitted by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company have been placed in the Commission's Public Document Room at 1717 H Street, N.W., Washington, D. C. and in San Luis Obispo County Free Library, 1354 Bishop Street, San Luis Obispo, California. The reports are also available at the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, Office of Intergovernmental Management, 1400 Tenth Street, Room 108, Sacramento, California.

Notice of availability of the applicant's Environmental Report was published in the Federal Register on January 4, 1972 (37 F.R. 28).

The reports have been analyzed by the Commission's Directorate of Licensing, and a Draft Environmental Statement related to the proposed continuation of Construction Permit No(s) CPPR-39, CPPR-69 for the Diablo Canyon Reactor Units 1 and 2, located at Pacific Gas and Electric Company's site in San Luis Obispo County, has been prepared and has been made available for public inspection at the locations designated above. Federal and State agencies are being provided with copies of the Draft Environmental Statement (local agencies may obtain this document on request), and when comments thereon of the Federal, State and local officials are received, they will be made available for public inspection at the above designated locations. Comments on the Draft Environmental Statement from interested members of the public should be addressed to the United States Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D. C. 20545, Attention: Deputy Director for Reactor Projects, Directorate of Licensing.
