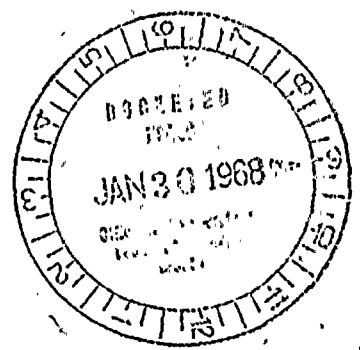

TO INTERVENE

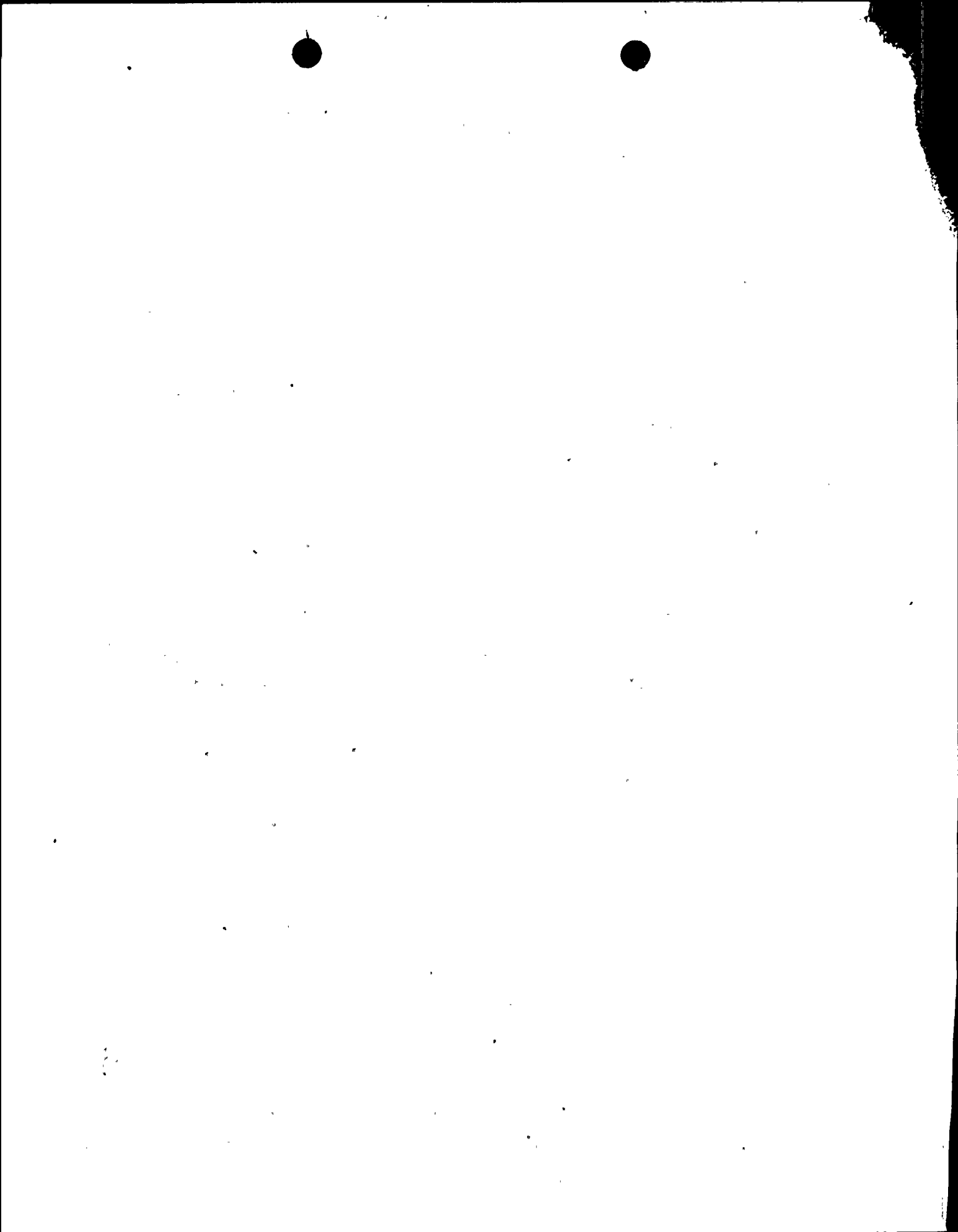
21 Comes now the aforementioned Petitioner before the
22 United States Atomic Energy Commission and respectfully represents
23 as follows:

24 1. That the Petitioner is the owner of the properties
25 upon which applicant proposes to construct an atomic electric
26 generating station; that Petitioner is lessor of the aforesaid
27 properties to the applicant, and as such has a vital and substantial
28 interest in the matter before the Commission.

29 2. That the aforementioned interest of Petitioner will
30 be materially and substantially affected by the action of the
31 Commission in the case before it.

32 3. Petitioner contends in the matter at hand that the
Pacific Gas & Electric Company has the capability and intention
of designing and constructing the atomic generating station so as
to provide reasonable assurance that operation of the plant will
not adversely affect the public safety, including the safety of

1 Petitioner and other persons resident on Petitioner's properties
2 in the immediate vicinity of the proposed generating plant and
3 its supporting facilities.

4 a. Petitioner further contends that its intervention
5 in the matter at hand, including the right to participate in the
6 hearing and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, is vital to
7 the protection of its interests in the properties under lease to
8 applicant, as well as in the adjoining properties owned, occupied
9 and under development by Petitioner.

10 WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays that it be granted leave to
11 intervene in the matter at hand, pursuant to the provisions of
12 Section 2.714 of the Commission's Rules of Practice, and that
13 Petitioner be permitted to become a party to the proceeding now
14 set for hearing in San Luis Obispo, California on February 20, 1968.

15 Pursuant to provisions of Section 2.708 of the
16 Commission's Rules of Practice, an original and twenty (20) con-
17 formed copies of this Petition are filed with the Commission this
18 date.
