

We are still checking the availability of your request no. 1, Report of the Ad Hoc Committee on Nuclear Safeguards; request no. 2, H. C. Paxton, Los Alamos Critical Mass Data, LAMS-3067; request no. 7, list of AEC documents, publications, etc. on the general subject of cancers, Leukemia, etc. found in the neighborhood of nuclear reactors; request no. 10, Hempelmann, L. H. et al., A Twenty-Seven Year Study of Selected Los Alamos Plutonium Workers, LA-5148-MS; request no. 12, an AEC bibliography of AEC and non-AEC studies and memoranda, etc. on the subject of population evacuation; and, request no. 14, a list of all AEC memoranda, drafts, and/or reports pertaining to the subject of public reaction to accidents involving radioactive releases of small or very large extent. I will inform you of further progress as information becomes available to me.

Regarding your request no. 4, the Shippingport facility is under the control of the U. S. Navy and is not an AEC-licensed commercial reactor; hence, it does not have an AEC operating license and technical specifications; thus, we cannot provide these documents.

Respecting request no. 11, in view of the dissimilarity of the Windscale reactor to the Diablo Canyon facilities, the Staff does not believe that any information which could be provided in regard to the Windscale accident could appear reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence in the Diablo Canyon proceeding. Accordingly, the Staff will not at this time provide the requested documents.

In regard to your request no. 13, I have been informed that copies of documents related to the AEC Steering Committee to Revise WASH-740 can only be made available at a charge of 10 cents per page. Further, I have been informed that there are about 2000 pages of documentation pertinent to your request. I would, therefore, ask that you advise me of your desires respecting this request.

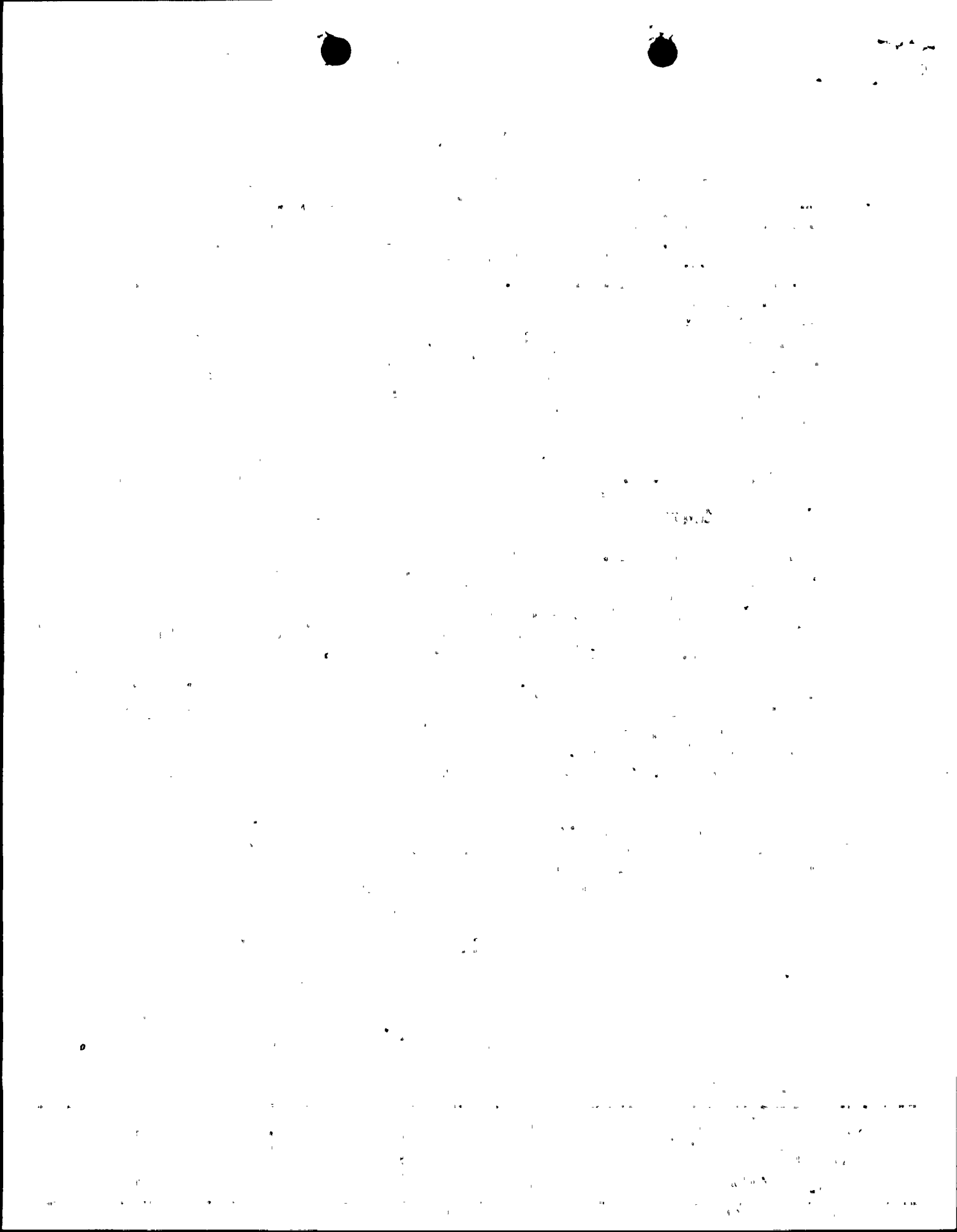
With respect to your request no. 18, ORNL-4451, Siting of Fuel Reprocessing Plants and Waste Management Facilities, the Staff believes that such information does not appear reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of evidence admissible in the Diablo Canyon proceeding.
