The San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace (MFP) Motion to Compel Discovery dated October 3, 1975, was mailed in an envelope postmarked October 6, 1975, which was the date used to calculate the time within which to respond.

RESPONSE

PGandE submits that the Motion is not well taken and that it should be denied.

- 1. The information requested by the interrogatories in question which concerns the experience at Humboldt Bay, is not relevant to this proceeding. The fact that something may or may not have happened at Humboldt Bay is not precedent for the same thing happening at Diablo Canyon. The two plants have different types of reactors, they contain different types of other equipment, and the Humboldt reactor has been in operation since 1963. Thus, responses to the interrogatories will not produce information which can properly be applied to this proceeding.
- The interrogatories request information outside the scope of the MFP Petition to Intervene. The Board's order dated May 30, 1974 did not accept contention 1.B for purposes of discovery. In addition, the MFP would have no standing to explore on-site doses to employees. Their interest should be limited to offsite doses.
