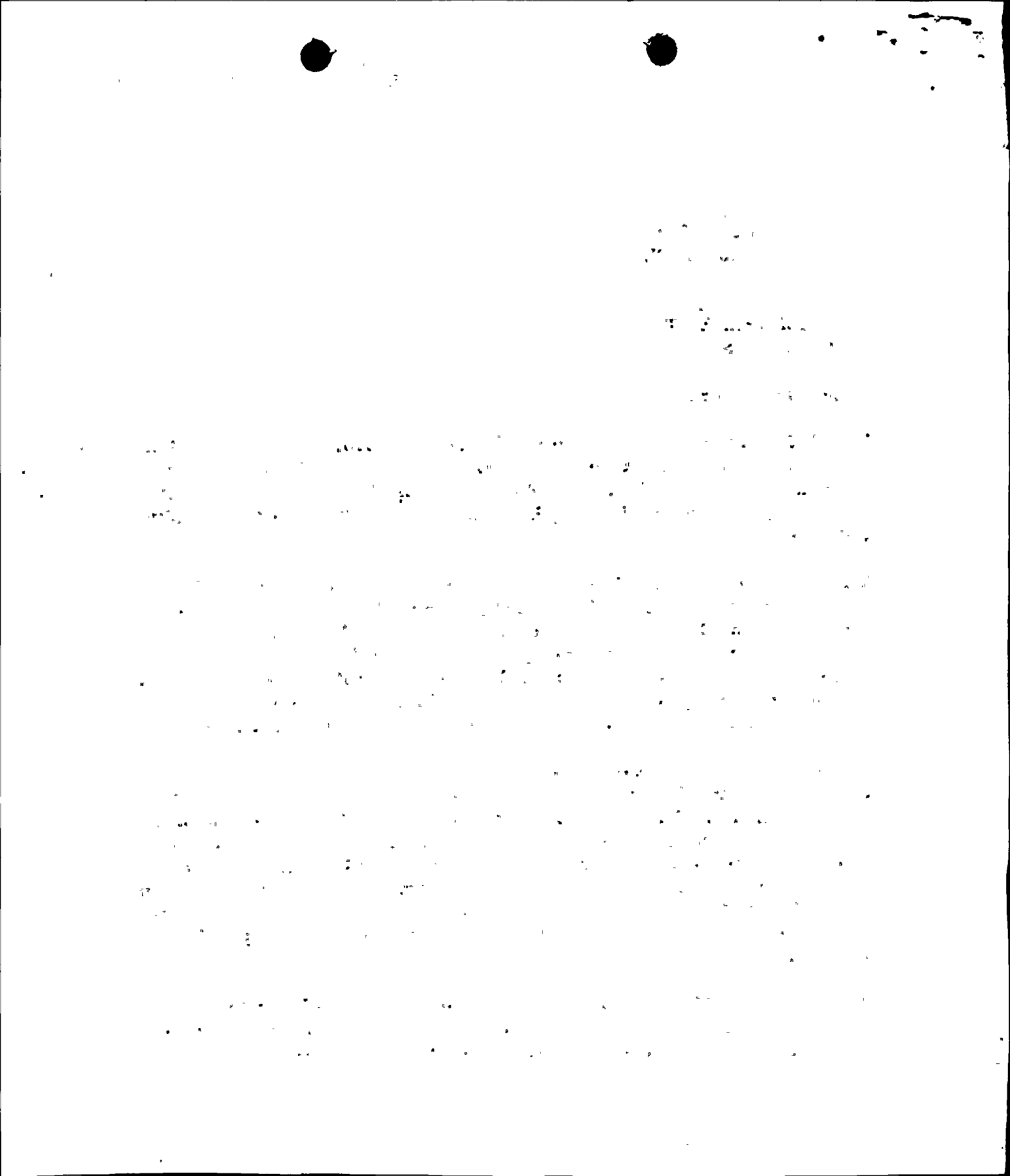
This is in response to your inquiry of March 31, 1976, regarding questions directed to you by Mrs. Gini Auger of Carmel Valley, California, in a mailgram dated March 1, 1976. Mrs. Auger expressed concern about a Nuclear Regulatory Commission hearing held on March 4, 1976, in Culver City, California.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission, through its Atomic Safety and Licensing Board (Licensing Board), is currently holding hearings concerning the licensing of the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Station located in San Luis Obispo, California. Two of the issues being considered by the Licensing Board in that proceeding are the adequacy of the plant to withstand earthquakes and the ability of the Applicant (Pacific Gas and Electric Company) to design a security plan sufficient to protect the fissionable materials at the site.

On March 4, 1976, the Licensing Board held an in camera pre-hearing conference at the Americana Hotel in Culver City, California, to discuss plans for the litigation of the issue of plant security at a forthcoming safety hearing. The matter of granting discovery of confidential information to the litigating parties and methods for the protection of this confidential material during litigation was discussed. The meeting was held in camera pursuant to 10 CFR § 2.790 to prevent the release of information which could compromise the security of a nuclear installation and thus possibly jeopardize the health and safety of the public.

The March 4, 1976 conference was concerned entirely with security matters and had nothing to do with the geologic and seismic situation at Diablo Canyon. That issue will be litigated by all of the parties, including
