FINAL SCHEDULING ORDER

In the above-captioned proceeding, this Licensing Board granted a hearing request by Mark Oncavage, Dan Kipnis, Southern Alliance for Clean Energy, and National Parks Conservation Association to challenge a combined license application by Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) to construct two new nuclear power reactors, Turkey Point Units 6 and 7, at FPL's facility near Homestead, Florida. See LBP-11-06, 73 NRC 149, 190, 251-52 (2011). On September 13, 2016, the Board convened a teleconference to discuss matters relating to case management, and we subsequently issued a provisional scheduling order pending the issuances of the NRC Staff's final review documents. See Licensing Board Memorandum and Order (Prehearing Conference Call Summary, Case Management Directive, and Scheduling Order) at 1, 3-6 (Oct. 5, 2016) (unpublished).

Thereafter, the NRC Staff issued the Final Environmental Impact Statement on October 28, 2016, and the Final Safety Evaluation Report on November 14, 2016. Accordingly, we now issue the final scheduling order, which culminates in an evidentiary hearing.
