**PART I.C COMMENTS (Continued)**

Your request, as clarified in an email exchange with the FOIA Office, sought six categories of documents:

1. NRC's "internal argument" on the FOIAs submitted on Fukushima. You clarified that you intended this category to include any recordings of telephone conversations within NRC offices during the processing of the FOIA requests for Fukushima records since 2013. There are no such recordings.
2. The Agency's policy drafted to deal with the FOIAs related to Fukushima. No policies were drafted since 2013.
3. NRC's review of the its response to the Fukushima-related FOIAs. Although the NRC did undertake a "lessons learned" review post-Fukushima that was geared toward strengthening the safety of U.S. nuclear power plants, this review did not address the processing of the FOIAs submitted on Fukushima.
4. The list of documents denied in full or in part that may now be released more broadly or in full. The NRC completed its work processing the FOIAs related to Fukushima in mid-2014. The NRC has not revisited the determinations made since that time; so no such list has been compiled as of the date of your request; the FOIA does not require agencies to create new records to respond to FOIA requests.
5. and 6. All records, and any other recordings of contacts by the Government of Japan, TEPCO or other foreign government agency, about the released Fukushima-related documents. The NRC has not received any records from the Government of Japan, TEPCO or other foreign government agency, concerning the records we released under the FOIA since 2013.

Dear FOIA Requester:

The FOIA Improvement Act of 2016, which was enacted on June 30, 2016, made several changes to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). Federal agencies must revise their FOIA regulations to reflect those changes by December 27, 2016. In addition to revising our regulations, we intend to update the Form 464, which we use to respond to FOIA requests.

In the interim, please see the comment box in Part I.C of the attached Form 464. The comment box includes information related to the recent changes to FOIA that is applicable to your FOIA request, including an updated time period for filing an administrative appeal with the NRC.
