STATEMENT OF ISSUES OF CONCERN

This Board's order dated November 16, 1979, which admitted Edmund G. Brown, Jr., Governor of the State of California, to participate in this proceeding pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.715(c), provided the following:

"In order for the participation of Governor Brown to be meaningful the other parties and the Board are entitled to know with some degree of specificity wherein his concerns lie. The parties are entitled to not be "surprised" and the Board needs to be apprised in order to determine if the issues are within its jurisdiction. We believe those issues can be identified within 30 days from receipt of this order and will expect to receive such a document or an appropriate motion."

Pursuant to this request, Governor Brown sets forth the following issues of concern:

- 1. Emergency planning and preparedness, including the impact of the lessons derived from the events associated with the Three Mile Island accident. Specific issues of concern include the following: (a) the capability of the operators to act and react effectively at all times; (b) the adequacy of existing emergency response plans for the Diablo Canyon plant; (c) the capability of the Applicant (Pacific Gas and Electric Company) and its designated personnel to take effective emergency action if required; (d) the capability of the Applicant's personnel and the off-site officials charged with ensuring public safety during an emergency to work efficiently and effectively in pursuit of evacuation or other protective actions; and (e) the practical working efficiency of the interrelationship among Applicant, the NRC, other concerned federal agencies, and the State of California, to respond decisively and constructively to an emergency in all ways that affect the public safety.
- 2. The other stipulated safety issues already before this Board and on which this Board has deferred its ruling pending the Three Mile Island analysis now being performed by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff, including quality assurance.

3. The failure of this Board to consider meaningfully the important subject of seismic focusing and high stress drop in issuing its Partial Initial Decision of September 27, 1979. (This matter is currently on appeal before the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board.)

At present, a measure of uncertainty pervades this proceeding, because the Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff has not completed its review of the record herein in light of the lessons learned from the Three Mile Island accident. Such review may reveal further issues of concern to the participants in this proceeding. Governor Brown reserves the right to pursue any such issues, should they arise, under the procedural requirements of 10 C.F.R. §.2.715(c).
