I particularly liked Casa Grande. So, two years back I spent some time in that city looking for a home that would serve my needs.

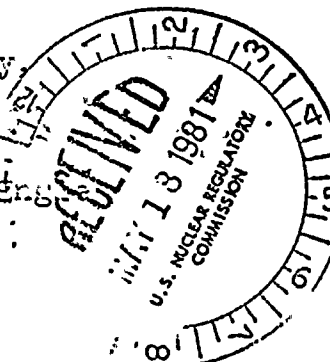

During the next few days you may be receiving a deluge of communications from a remaining handful of obstructionists who are dedicated to delaying the operating license for Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant. This plant, initiated fourteen (14) years ago, has been ready for operation for the past several months.

In June 1976 nuclear power opponents placed an anti-nuclear initiative on the California State ballot. When the votes were counted, the initiative had lost by a statewide margin of 65-35 percent. HOWEVER, SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY VOTERS HAD REJECTED THE INITIATIVE BY A MARGIN OF 68-32 PERCENT. That was five years ago, when Diablo construction was close to completion.

Diablo conforms to all standards and safety regulations. The reactors and generating equipments were manufactured by a company which has an outstanding operating record - a company which has manufactured or licensed the largest number of fission reactors in the world.

Diablo should be licensed for operation NOW! There have been enough duplicative hearings. Further hearings are delaying tactics only.

The California Council for Environmental and Economic Balance (a non-partisan organization) has completed a study on the basis of 500 kilowatt-hours per month used by the average home. PG&E customers who now pay an average of \$32 per month, in 1990 would pay an average \$129 per month with a two year nuclear delay, and \$158 per month with complete nuclear shutdown.

We speak for many friends and neighbors, all of whom live within 25 miles of Diablo.

Please - deny the obstructionists any further delay.

Please consider these matters, Sir. We will be praying for your guidance!



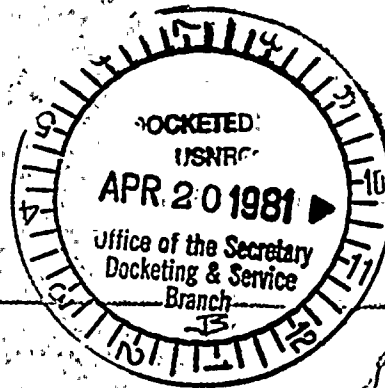

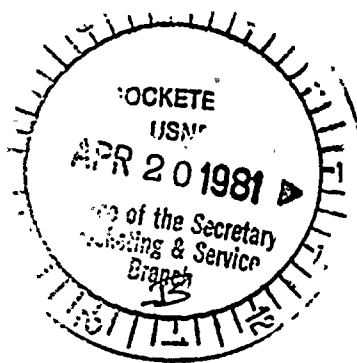

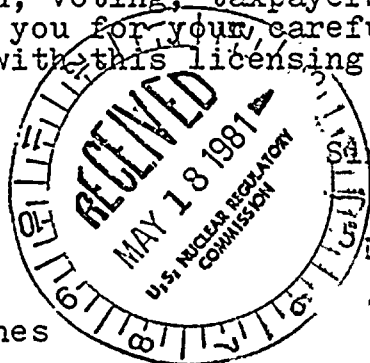
Dear Sir:

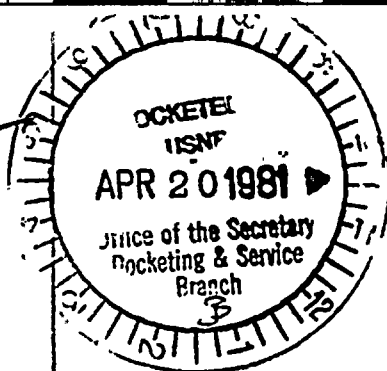

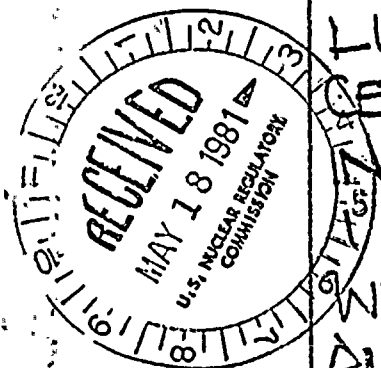

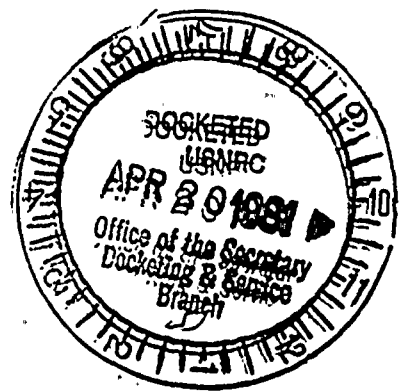

I am writing to you as a concerned citizen who not only objects to the building and further development and opening of the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Plant, but who also objects to the Nuclear issue as well.

Three Mile Island and PG & E's Humboldt Bay Plant are currently sitting, waiting for further funds to decommission them, possibly hundreds of millions of dollars, to decontaminize them into a safe level of nuclear waste.

What are the long-term effects of NRC-allowed low-level radioactive emissions from operating plants, as it is incorporated and recycled through our soil, water and our food supply in ever-increasing concentrations near the plant?

The issue to stress about the proposed Nuclear Plant in Diablo Canyon is the Hosgri Fault less than 3 miles away from the plant. This active fault can create an earthquake roughly ten times stronger than the plant was originally designed to withstand. PG & E claims to have upgraded the structure, but these changes are external only- the basic plant remains unchanged.

Another last comment I'd like to add is this. The current plan under preparation admits that in an emergency situation of nuclear release into our environment, the only action local citizens can take to protect themselves is to stay indoors and close the windows. Shouldn't we know a lot more about ways to create a safer means of power, than how to learn to protect ourselves from our mistakes?

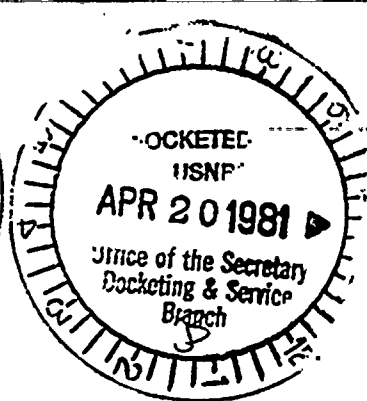
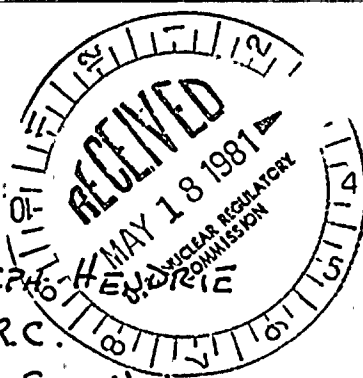

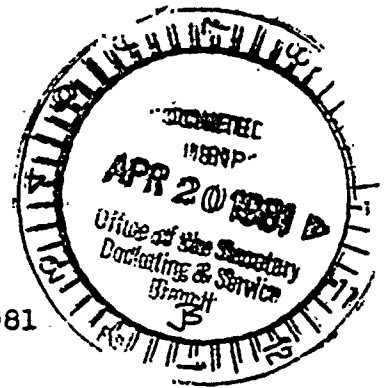

I'm writing to protest the licensing of Diablo Nuclear Power Plant. There are several reasons I am against this.

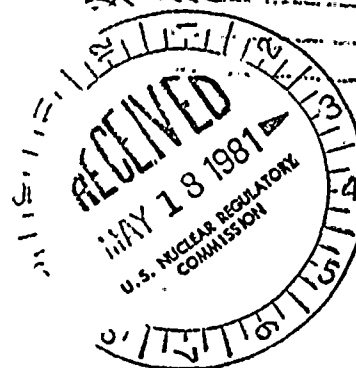
The first is the danger of the Hosgri Fault so close to the site. I don't think there is any way to make the plant safe enough to withstand a big earthquake.

I speak not only for myself, but many other who may not write, but will surely protest.



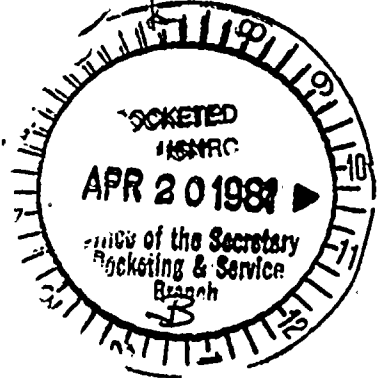
