



SUBJECT: Exercise Report for the October 30, 1984, Exercise of
the Offsite Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP)
Plans for the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant

Attached are two copies of the Exercise Report for the October 30, 1984, partial participation joint exercise of the offsite REP plans for the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant. Although offsite jurisdictions were eligible for a biennial exercise schedule, they elected to participate in the regularly scheduled annual exercise. The primary offsite jurisdiction that fully participated in the exercise was San Luis Obispo County located in the 10-mile plume emergency planning zone. The State of California Office of Emergency Services, Santa Barbara County, and the cities within San Luis Obispo County confined their exercise participation to communications and warning systems, coordination, and liaison activities effected from the San Luis Obispo County Emergency Operations Center. No evaluator was assigned to observe activities within those facilities and therefore no individual findings directed to those facilities are contained in the report.

The exercise report, dated November 14, 1984, was submitted on November 20, 1984, by Region IX of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Areas identified as being in need of strengthening related to (1) integration of plans and improved systems for the radiological field monitoring teams and (2) improved information flow within the emergency operations center. The deficiencies observed were all Category B type deficiencies. They are discussed in the section titled "Exercise Details" and are listed in the section titled "Exercise Findings Matrix."

FEMA Region IX staff will furnish a copy of this exercise report to the State of California and request a schedule of corrective actions. As soon as we receive and analyze their response, we will forward this information to you.

Based on the results of the October 1984 exercise, there continues to be reasonable assurance that appropriate protective measures can be implemented by offsite jurisdictions around the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant to protect the health and safety of the public in the event of a radiological emergency.
