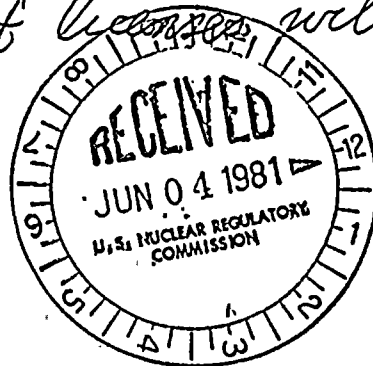

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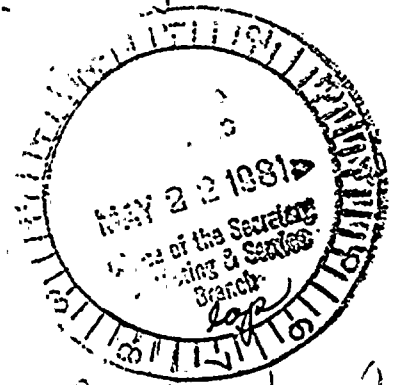

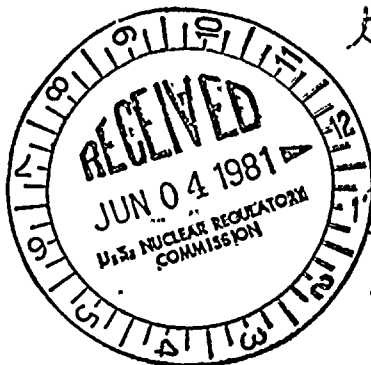
Dear Sir

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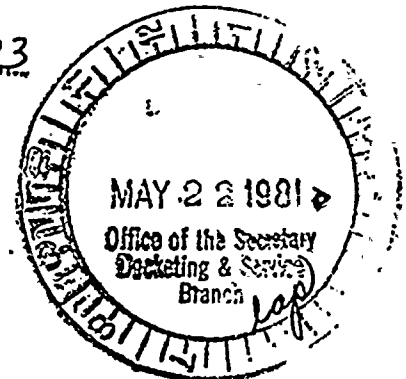

Dear Sir;

On May 19th, the licensing board holds yet another hearing on Diablo Canyon.

Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant has had fuel on site and been ready to produce power for approximately five years. As evidence has been produced to show need for structural or operation improvements, these have been complied with by the utility company. In some instances, P.G.&E. has initiated upgrading on its own to assure safety of operation.

There is strong evidence that the hearing process has been used to continually prolong the licensing and operation of the Diablo plant.

We urge that every effort be applied to expedite the processes and eliminate unnecessary procedural operations.

Today, power continues to be produced from costly petroleum fuels that can better serve us in the manufacture of important products that are essential in other industries. In addition, our consuming public are forced to pay increased energy costs that not only have a direct effect, but inflate the cost of all processed goods.

Our economy needs Diablo, lets stop any further delays.
