

Pursuant to 10 CFR 26.71(d), PG&E is submitting the enclosed Fitness for Duty (FFD) Performance Report for the period January through June 1993. The performance data have been compiled on the standard forms developed by NUMARC (revised January 1992) and are provided in Enclosure 1. Statistical analysis of the data was conducted and the results are provided in Enclosure 2.

During this reporting period, no licensed operators or supervisors tested positive; therefore, no 24-hour telephone notifications were made as required by 10 CFR 26.73. As noted on the enclosed data form, individuals being screened for initial unescorted security access (pre-employment testing 60 days prior to being cleared) are tested at lower cut-off levels for marijuana and amphetamines, and are tested for three additional substances. This testing is reported under the pre-access category and is conducted in accordance with 10 CFR 26.





### **ENCLOSURE 2**

### STATISTICAL ANALYSIS FOR REPORTING PERIOD JANUARY - JUNE 1993

- 1. The random positive rate for this reporting period decreased to 0.15%, continuing the downward trend as seen in previous reporting periods.
- 2. Analysis of the data indicates that at the current rate of testing, 105.3% of the average population eligible for random selection would be tested by year end.
- 3. Marijuana, cocaine, and alcohol remain the "drugs of choice" in all testing categories (pre-access, random, for-cause, and follow-up). During this reporting period, marijuana accounted for 55% of the positives, cocaine 14%, and alcohol 17%. Marijuana is predominantly the cause for pre-access positive test results, while cocaine is predominantly the cause for random positive test results.
