Pursuant to 10 CFR 26.71(d), PG&E is submitting the enclosed Fitness for Duty (FFD) Performance Report for the period July through December 1993. The performance data have been compiled on the standard forms developed by NUMARC (revised January 1992) and are provided in Enclosure 1. Statistical analysis of the data was conducted and the results are provided in Enclosure 2.

During this reporting period, no licensed operators or supervisors tested positive. One 24-hour telephone notification was made as required by 10 CFR 26.73(a)(1) regarding prescription medication use. In addition, a 10 CFR 26, Appendix A 2.8(e)(4) report was submitted regarding false negative results during the implementation of our blind performance test program. As noted on the enclosed data form, individuals being screened for initial unescorted security access (pre-employment testing 60 days prior to being cleared) are tested at lower cut-off levels for marijuana and amphetamines, and are tested for three additional substances. This testing is reported under the pre-access category and is conducted in accordance with 10 CFR 26.

STATISTICAL ANALYSIS FOR REPORTING PERIOD
JULY - DECEMBER 1993

1. There are no random positive results during this reporting period. During 1993, the random positive rate decreased to 0.11 percent, continuing the downward trend as seen in previous reporting periods.
2. Analysis of the data indicates that for the year ending December 31, 1993, 104.8 percent of the average eligible population were tested.



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
