Dear Mr. Shaw,

This is in reference to COL Huff's letter dated November 18, 2016, requesting for amendment to Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 19-08330-03, Docket No. 03006931. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

You have provided your background in radiation safety, but it does not appear that you specifically described your experience with Part 36 irradiators. NUREG-1556, Volume 6, "Consolidated Guidance About Materials Licenses Program-Specific Guidance About 10 CFR Part 36 Irradiator Licenses," Section 8.7.1 states:

"...the RSO was previously an RSO at a similar licensee or was trained as an irradiator operator but has not had experience working at an irradiator, he or she should have the equivalent of at least 40 hours in self-study or directed study on information directly applicable to radiation safety at irradiators. This should include applicable regulations (10 CFR Parts 20 and 36) and reports or studies describing case histories of accidents or problems at irradiators; see Appendix G. The license application should list the documents studied or to be studied in the description of the training of the proposed RSO and should describe how the applicant will evaluate the individual's comprehension of the information studied. The RSO should have at least 3 months (full-time equivalent) of experience at the applicant's irradiator or at another irradiator of a similar type.

Please provide a description of your specific experience at a similar facility, a list of documents studied and how the licensee has evaluated your comprehension, and the amount of experience at the irradiator or similar irradiator of a similar type.

We will continue our review upon receipt of this information. Please reply to my attention at the Region 1 Office (Address below) and refer to Mail Control No. <No>. If you have technical questions regarding this letter, please call me at (610) 337-5366.

Your reply must be an originally signed and dated letter. The letter may be scanned and submitted as a pdf document attached to an email; or it may be transmitted by facsimile to (610) 337-5269; or it may be sent by regular mail. If we do not receive a reply from you within 30 calendar days from the date of this e-mail, we will assume that you do not wish to pursue your application OR amendment request.
