PROGRAM SCOPE This was an unannounced, routine inspection of a licensee authorized to possess and use portable moisture-density gauges (Troxler Model 3400 series) at the licensee's facility located in Kansas City, Missouri, and at temporary job sites anywhere in the United States where the NRC maintains regulatory jurisdiction. At the time of the inspection, the licensee possessed two Troxler Model 3440 gauges. No temporary job site work was scheduled on the day of inspection. At the time of the inspection, all gauges were in storage at the licensee's facility with two tangible, independent barriers. The licensee has a total of five authorized gauge users (including the RSO). Training certificates for users were maintained by the RSO.								
The inspector toured the licensee's office to evaluate the licensee's measures for material security, hazard communication, and exposure controls. The gauges were adequately secured behind two barriers in the licensee's facility. During business hours, the gauges were under constant surveillance by authorized staff members.								
The gauge user demonstrated that he maintained control and constant surveillance of the licensee's gauge at all times when at a job site. The gauge user also maintained two independent physical controls that formed tangible barriers against unauthorized removal of the gauge whenever it was not in use, using a series of locks and chains to secure the gauge in its transport case in the back of his truck The inspector discussed the use and transportation of the gauge with the user and found him to be knowledgeable of radiation protection principles and licensee procedures. The inspector also reviewed the licensee's operating and emergency procedures, in addition to the gauge's shipping papers and leak tests.								
No violations of NRC requirements were identified during this inspection.
