On January 13, 2017, Source Production and Equipment Company, Inc. (SPEC) sent a request to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to obtain a one-time exemption of the notification requirement in 10 CFR Part 110.50(c) to provide at least 7 days advanced notice of an import. SPEC requested the exemption because their customer in South Africa needed to replace the material with another shipment as soon as possible.

The NRC hereby grants your request for exemption because, in accordance with 10 CFR 110.10, the requested exemption:

1. Is authorized by law;
2. Is not inimical to the common defense and security; and
3. Does not constitute an unreasonable risk to the public health and safety.

The granting of an exemption does not relieve any person from complying with the regulations of other U.S. Federal and/or State government agencies applicable to exports or imports under their authority.
