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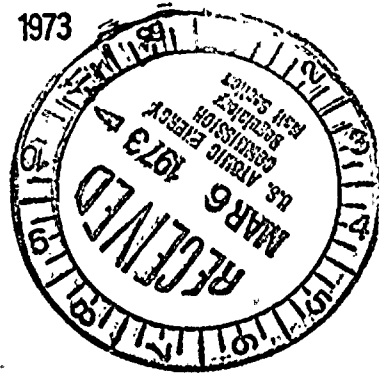

Dear Mr. Muller:

This is in response to your letter of January 17, 1973, wherein you requested comments on the draft environmental impact statement for the Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station Unit 2, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation, Docket Number 50-410.

This Department has reviewed the health aspects of the above project as presented in the documents submitted. The following comment is offered:

Page 5-17: The cumulative dose to a truckdriver, if he were to transport 42 truckloads of Solid Radioactive Wastes in a year, is estimated to be 630 mrem per year. The question then arises as to the classification of the truck driver as a "radiation worker" or an "individual" in the general population, since the estimated dose of 630 mrem exceeds the FRC guidelines for the annual dose to an individual in the general population.

The opportunity to review the draft environmental impact statement is appreciated.
