Your July 31, 1980 Inspection and Enforcement Bulletin 80-19 and Revision #1 requested actions regarding failures of Mercury Wetted Matrix Relays in Reactor Protective Systems at Nine Mile Point Unit #1. The following addresses Item 1 of that Bulletin.

Investigations have concluded that presently there are no relays of the type or application described in the Bulletin at this station. An estimate of the manpower expended to conduct the review and report preparation is 8 man hours.

Actions described herein complete response requirements for this Bulletin. Any additional information or records are readily available at your request.

The information contained in this letter demonstrates that continued operation of Nine Mile Point Unit #1 does not present an undue safety hazard to the public.
