My letter of March 31, 1981 informed you of delays in equipment delivery associated with the emergency planning effort for Nine Mile Point Unit 1. Provided below is a discussion of the resolution of these delays.

With the exception of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Emergency Notification System in the alternate Emergency Operations Facility, all communication systems are in place and operational. Niagara Mohawk has ordered the Emergency Notification System for the alternate Emergency Operation Facility. However, due to modifications being made by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Niagara Mohawk does not expect installation until final design is completed by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

All equipment required for the Emergency Operation Facility and the alternate Emergency Operation Facility is now in place. My March 31, 1981 letter indicated that printers and cathode ray tubes mentioned in the Emergency Planning Procedures for the Emergency Operation Facility had not been delivered. Since these are not required by either Appendix E to 10 CFR Part 50 or the Nine Mile Point Emergency Plan, Niagara Mohawk has revised the Emergency Planning Procedures so that these are no longer required. Data from the control room and Technical Support Center to the Emergency Operation Facility will be transmitted verbally.
