Niagara Mohawk's letter dated February 22, 1982 requested your concurrence with our position to reclassify the Unit 2 Radwaste Building as a Quality Assurance Category II structure. At an April 22, 1982 meeting, members of your staff requested additional information regarding the design and construction of the Radwaste Building. The requested information is provided below.

In addition to being designed to meet the safe shutdown earthquake, the Radwaste Building will be designed and constructed in accordance with the requirements of the American Concrete Institute Building Code Requirements for Reinforced Concrete ACI-318-71.

Upon being reclassified as a Quality Assurance Category II (nonsafety related) structure, the Radwaste Building will have the same Quality Assurance/Quality Control controls applied to it as any other Category II structure which is being constructed or has been constructed at the Unit 2 site. ~~The Quality Assurance Program for the construction of nonsafety related structures, systems and components is the same as for safety related structures as described in the Nine Mile Point Unit 2 Quality Assurance Program Manual, except that the documentation requirements and frequency of inspections are reduced. The documentation requirements and the frequency of inspections is determined by the applicable specifications and Inspection Plans.~~

It is recognized that the extent of Quality Assurance being applied to the construction of the Radwaste Building is commensurate with its importance to safety. Accordingly, the Niagara Mohawk Quality Assurance Department and SWEC


