Our December 1, 1982 letter provided detailed technical information regarding Class 1E protection packages to be installed on the reactor protection motor generator sets at Nine Mile Point Unit 1. We also indicated that we would submit technical specifications by February 1, 1983. Subsequent to that, our letter of December 15, 1982 indicated that implementation of this modification had been delayed until the 1984 refueling and maintenance outage. On February 1, 1983 we indicated that these specifications would be submitted June 1, 1983.

In order to submit technical specifications with respect to these Class 1E protection packages, it is necessary to obtain NRC concurrence on the proposed modification. We will submit technical specifications within 60 days of your concurrence with our December 1, 1982 submittal.
