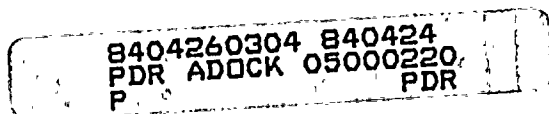

During our meeting of April 10, 1984, we discussed Nine Mile Point Unit 1 participation in the Integrated Safety Assessment Program. We understand that, as applied to Nine Mile Point Unit 1, this program will include the following main elements:

- Systematic review of outstanding issues for our plant, both licensing requirements and utility-initiated plant improvements, in a specific scope of review which is agreed upon in advance by both the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation.
- An integrated assessment in the second year of the program for Nine Mile Point Unit 1. This integrated assessment will be based on deterministic findings, judgments made during the Systematic Evaluation Program for similar operating plants, insights from Probabilistic Safety Assessments on similar plants and possible, limited scope Probabilistic Safety Assessments for specific Nine Mile Point Unit 1 issues.
- An integrated schedule for Nine Mile Point Unit 1 as a final product of the integrated assessment.
- Deferral of existing licensing requirements, where necessary and justified, in order to permit efficient resolution of open issues in the integrated assessment.
- Deferral of interim findings of the program until they are dispositioned as part of the integrated assessment, except those of immediate safety significance.

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- The project manager will be an important part of the Integrated Safety Assessment Program process to maintain the continuity of the day-to-day licensing communication between the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation.

Based on our understandings, we are interested in participating in this Integrated Safety Assessment Program. We concur that such a program has the potential to bring order to the licensing process, allow us to factor in needed plant improvements and make more efficient use of available resources.

We suggest that a working meeting be arranged in the near future to work out the details of how the Integrated Safety Assessment Program elements will be implemented for Nine Mile Point Unit 1.
