Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission's regulations in 10 CFR Part 51, notice is hereby given that a Draft Environmental Statement (NUREG-1085) has been prepared by the Commission's Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation related to the proposed operation of the Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station, Unit 2 located on the southeast shore of Lake Ontario in Scriba, Oswego County, New York. The Draft Environmental Statement (DES) addresses the aquatic, terrestrial, radiological, social and economic impacts associated with normal station operation. Station accidents, their likelihood of occurrence and their consequences, including severe accidents, are addressed in Section 5.9 of this statement.

Copies of NUREG-1085 are available for inspection by the public in the Commission's Public Document Room at 1717 H Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20555, and at the Pennfield Library, State University College, Oswego, New York 13126. The document is also being made available at the State Clearinghouse, New York State Division of the Budget, State Capitol, Albany, New York 12224. A free single copy of Draft NUREG-1085, to the extent of supply, may be requested for public comment by writing to the Publication Services Section, Document Management Branch, Division of Technical Information and Document Control, U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D. C. 20555.

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Interested persons may submit comments on this DES for the Commission's -consideration. Federal, State, and specified local agencies are being provided with copies of the DES. Other local agencies may obtain these documents upon request.

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Comments by Federal State and local officials, or other members of the public received by the Commission will be made available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Document Room in Washington, D. C. and the Pennfield Library, State University College, Oswego, New York. Comments are due by October-1, 1984 After consideration of the comments submitted on the DES, the Commission's staff will prepare a Final Environmental Statement, the availability of which will be published in the <u>Federal Register</u>.
