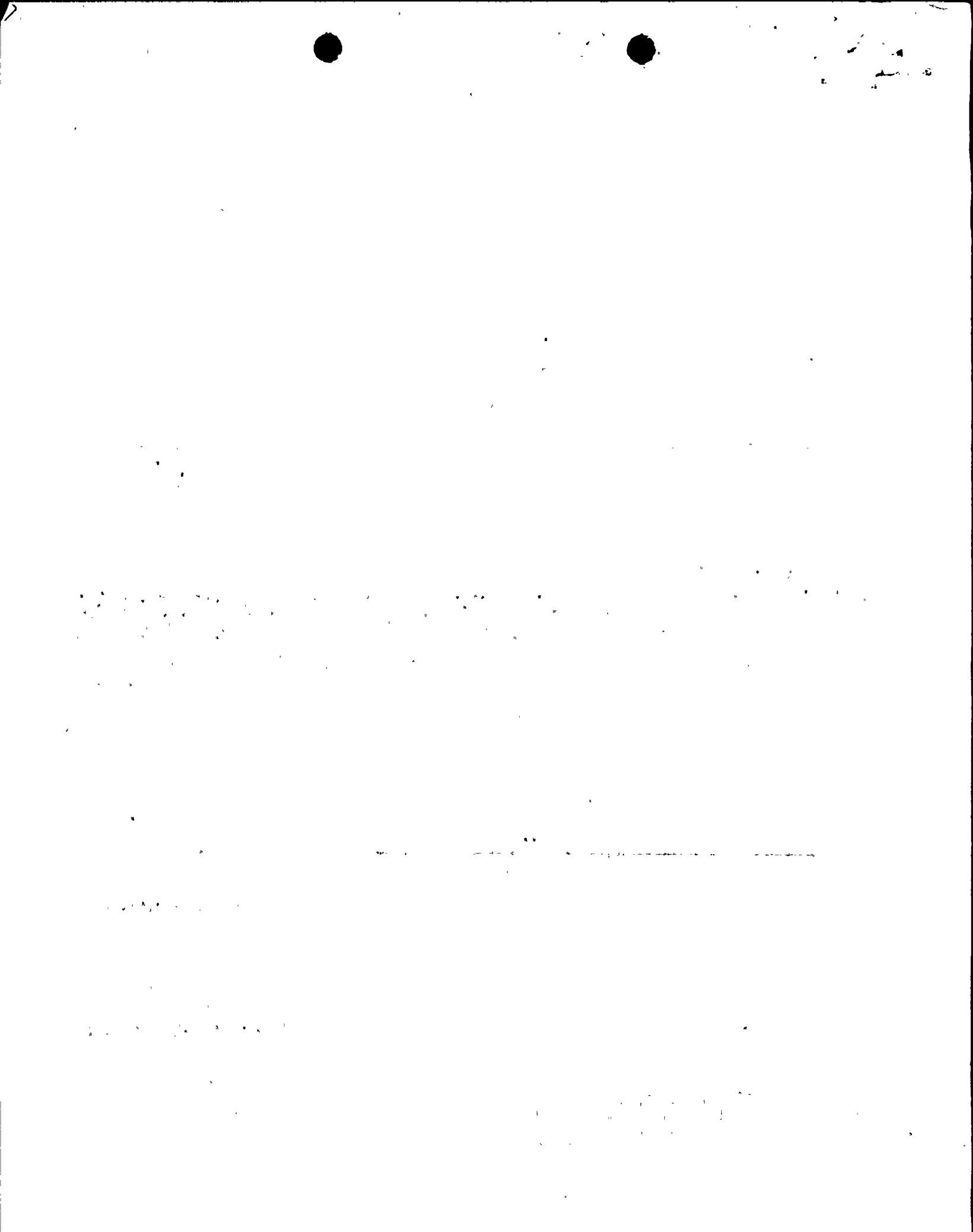

PUBLIC NOTICE - F-84-440

Date of Issuance - December 12, 1984

The New York State Department of State is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The applicant has certified that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The applicant's consistency certification and accompanying public information and data are available for inspection at the New York State Department of State.

The Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation, 300 Erie Boulevard West, Syracuse, NY 13202, has applied to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission for an operating license for the Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station, Unit 2. Unit 2 is located on the southeast shore of Lake Ontario in the Town of Scriba, Oswego County, New York. It will share the site with Niagara Mohawk's Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station Unit 1. The Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station site is contiguous to the James A. Fitzpatrick Nuclear Power Plant which is owned and operated by the NYS Power Authority. Unit 2 employs a nuclear steam supply system consisting of a single-cycle, forced circulating boiling water reactor. The plant rated core thermal power level is 3,323 Mwt, corresponding to an electrical output of approximately 1,100 MWe. The Unit 2 primary containment is a steel-lined, reinforced-concrete enclosure housing the reactor and suppression pool. The reactor building completely encloses the primary containment. The source and discharge of cooling water is Lake Ontario. The intake system conveys water from Lake Ontario through two submerged intake structures, which are independently connected to the screen well by intake pipes located within separate tunnels below the lake bottom. One tunnel also contains a discharge pipe that conveys service water system effluent, cooling tower blowdown, and liquid waste effluent to the submerged offshore discharge diffuser. Power generated at Unit 2 will be fed into the New York Power Pool inter-connected electrical system. The approximate schedule for Unit 2 fuel loading and commercial operation is March 1986 and October 1986, respectively.

Any interested parties and/or agencies desiring to express their views concerning the proposed activity may do so by filing their comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., 30 days from the date of publication of this notice, or January 11, 1984, whichever date occurs sooner.
