On February 9, 2017, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security inspection at your Beaver Valley Power Station. The NRC inspectors discussed the results of the inspection with Mr. Darin Benyak, Vice President Fleet Support, and other members of your staff. The results of this inspection are documented in the enclosed report.

The NRC inspectors documented one finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as non-cited violation (NCV) consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest this violation or the significance, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555 0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region I; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555 0001; and the NRC resident inspector at the Beaver Valley Power Station.

One cross-cutting aspect was assigned to a finding in the area of Human Performance, Training. Specifically, the licensee failed to provide training and ensure knowledge transfer to maintain a knowledgeable, technically competent workforce and instill nuclear safety values [H.9]. If you disagree with the cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your disagreement, to the Regional Administrator, Region I; and the NRC resident inspector at the Beaver Valley Power Station.
