Dear Ms. Colon:

On June 8, 2016, Randolph Ragland of this office commenced a security inspection at your Rios Piedras, Puerto Rico facility. On November 9, 2016, Mr. Ragland conducted additional interviews and document reviews at your Philadelphia, Pennsylvania office. The inspection continued in office until February 26, 2017. The inspection was limited to a review of your implementation of the security requirements in 10 CFR 37. The inspection consisted of observations by the inspector, interviews with personnel, and selective examination of representative records. The findings were discussed with you, and Ada Diaz and Edda Rodriguez of your organization by telephone at the conclusion of the inspection on March 1, 2017.

Based on the results of this inspection and in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, the NRC has determined that two violations of NRC requirements occurred. The current Enforcement Policy is included on NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violations are cited because they were identified by the NRC. The violations appear in Enclosure 1 to this letter. Enclosure 2 provides a determination of severity level and a description of the corrective and preventative actions taken by Cruz Roja Americana, to address the violations.

The NRC has concluded that information regarding the reason for the violations, the corrective actions taken and planned to correct the violations and prevent recurrence is already adequately addressed in our records. Therefore, you are not required to respond to this letter unless the description of your corrective actions in this letter does not accurately reflect your corrective actions or your position. In that case, or if you choose to provide additional information, you should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice.
