Sir,

CSMI acknowledges receipt of your notification on February 15, 2017 that per 10 CFR 30.36(d)(3), since no principal activities under CSMI's license have been conducted for a period of 24 months, we are required to notify the NRC and begin the decommissioning process or request relief from the regulation.

CSMI respectfully requests relief from the timeliness rule, as described in 10 CFR 30.36(f), and asks that the NRC extend the time period that CSMI may qualify to be a licensee for an additional two years. This would extend our time limit for not conducting principal activities through February 2019.

We do not, nor have we ever, possessed nuclear materials at our site. Therefore, the relief we seek would not be detrimental to the public health and safety.

CSMI, LLC is a Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) with 3-year average receipts for taxable years 2014-2016 of less than \$4.0M. This is well under the \$7.0M 3-year average receipts criteria that the NRC uses to qualify an organization as a small business.

CSMI needs the NRC license to bid on future US Department of Defense solicitations that require said license. If CSMI lost its license it would be a hardship for our small disadvantaged business by removing our ability to compete for US Department of Defense Prime and Subcontracts.

The public interest will be served because being a small disadvantaged business with low overhead, CSMI can perform work required by the future needs of the national defense industry at a reduced cost over larger defense industry competitors and partners. In this case, the public interest does coincide with the applicant's economic interest.
