## General Comment

I am greatly concerned that the highest level of deadly nuclear waste material, including nuclear fuel rods, should not be stored near Andrews, Texas and more especially that these materials should not be transported through the Dallas-Ft Worth Metroplex (home of nearly nine million people), San Antonio, and El Paso. An incident with nuclear transportation would be catastrophic for these regions.

Industry advocates always claim that everything associated with nuclear wastes is always done safely. But we know first hand from many, many unfortunate experiences with oil and gas pipelines, fracking operations, coal mining, and the like, that accidents happen far too often. Much as we dislike these accidents, they do not involve the spreading of radioactivity into our home neighborhoods.
