SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR CONSENT TO INDIRECT LICENSE TRANSFER AND
AMENDMENT

Dear Ms. Bryant:


By letter dated January 24, 2017, InnerVision Advanced Medical Imaging submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Region III Office a Request for Consent to an indirect License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 13-32273-01. Based on the information provided, we understand that the licensee is owned 50% by Unity Healthcare, LLC and 50% by Franciscan Alliance, Inc. Unity Healthcare, LLC intends to purchase Franciscan Alliance's 50% of the business and will have 100% ownership of InnerVision Advanced Medical Imaging. After the transaction, the licensee will continue to operate as a division within Unity Healthcare, LLC and the licensee's name will be changed to Unity Healthcare, LLC d/b/a InnerVision Advanced Medical Imaging Center.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the proposed transfer. Please note that you will need to notify us promptly, in writing, after the transaction has been finalized and include a signed copy of documentation confirming completion of the transaction. With this information, we can issue an administrative amendment to your NRC license to reflect the transaction, including for any specified name change, if necessary. If this planned transaction has not been closed within 30 days of the date of this letter, please notify us in writing.
