1. The report identifies:

- Significant reduction in the effectiveness of a package during use;
- Defect with a safety significance;
- Shipment in which conditions of the approval were not observed.

2. What is the safety significance? High Medium Low

3. Summary of the report:

The Drawing No. R65009, Rev. N which was specified in Certificate No. 9269, Rev. 9 specified that the package nameplate should be attached to the package using four stainless steel rivets. When manufactured the nameplate was attached using five stainless steel rivets, instead of four.

4. Corrective actions taken by the licensee:

The certificate holder requested a revision to the certificate to incorporate drawings showing that the nameplate should be attached to the package body using at more than 1 stainless steel rivet. NRC issued Certificate No. 9269, Rev.10 on February 24, 2017, to incorporate the revised drawing.

5. Staff comments:
