Dear Mr. Ahearne:

Delays in licensing the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant are causing waste of needed fuel and financial resources. Following 14 years of construction and 200 days of hearings, the plant, already the most carefully scrutinized of all nuclear power plants, should be put on line. The Diablo plant is not producing one kilowatt of electricity, yet is costing 2.5 million dollars per day. How can such cost be justified in light of our current energy situation? Our dependence on foreign oil is a major political and inflation problem.

The careful work of the NRC is valued in terms of nuclear power plant safety. However, after days of expert testimony, the time is here to license the plant and help "....get America going".

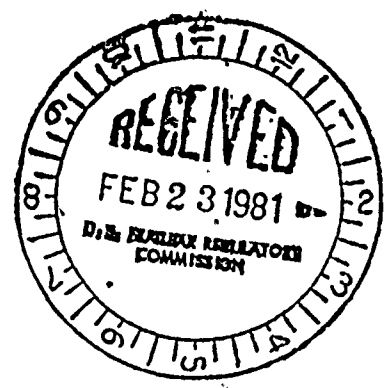
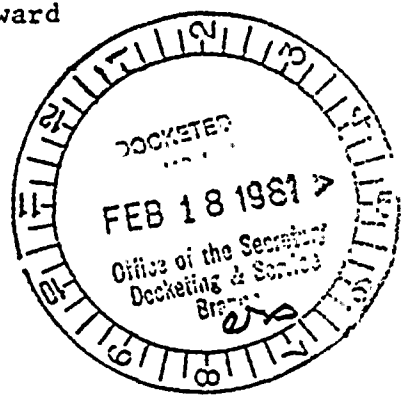
Your immediate action is needed to award the operating license for Diablo Canyon in the very near future.


Dear Chairman Ahearne:

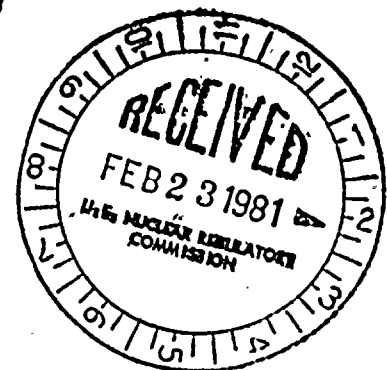
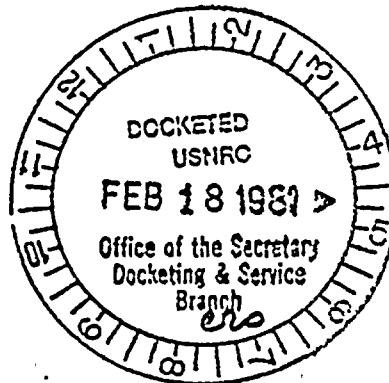
