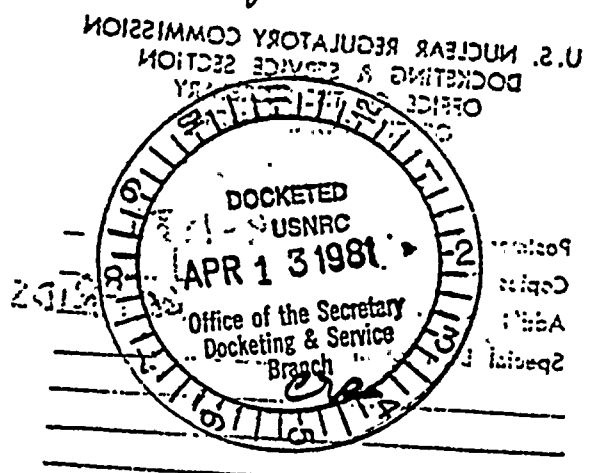


Dear Mr. Aheane -

Dear Chairman Ahearn

The 2,000 megawatt Diablo Canyon station nuclear plant at San Luis Obispo has been ready for five years. This could cut California's electric costs by approx. \$80 million per month if licensed. This plant could save 20 million barrels of foreign oil per year, \$2 million / day replacement costs and \$1 1/2 million in interest charges.

The San Onofre station near San Clemente has one unit operating and two more ready. Three units operating could save 100,000 barrels of oil / day.

I urge the speedy licensing of the Diablo Canyon nuclear plant and the units two and three of the San Onofre station.

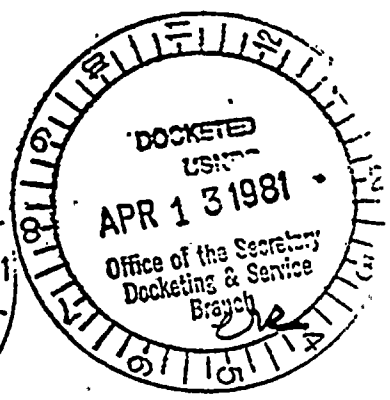
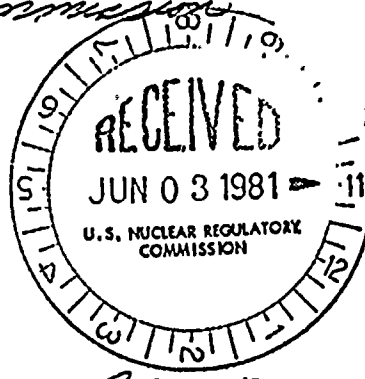

I urge you to speed up licensing of the two nuclear power plants in California - Diablo Canyon station at San Luis Obispo & the San Onofre station near San Clemente.

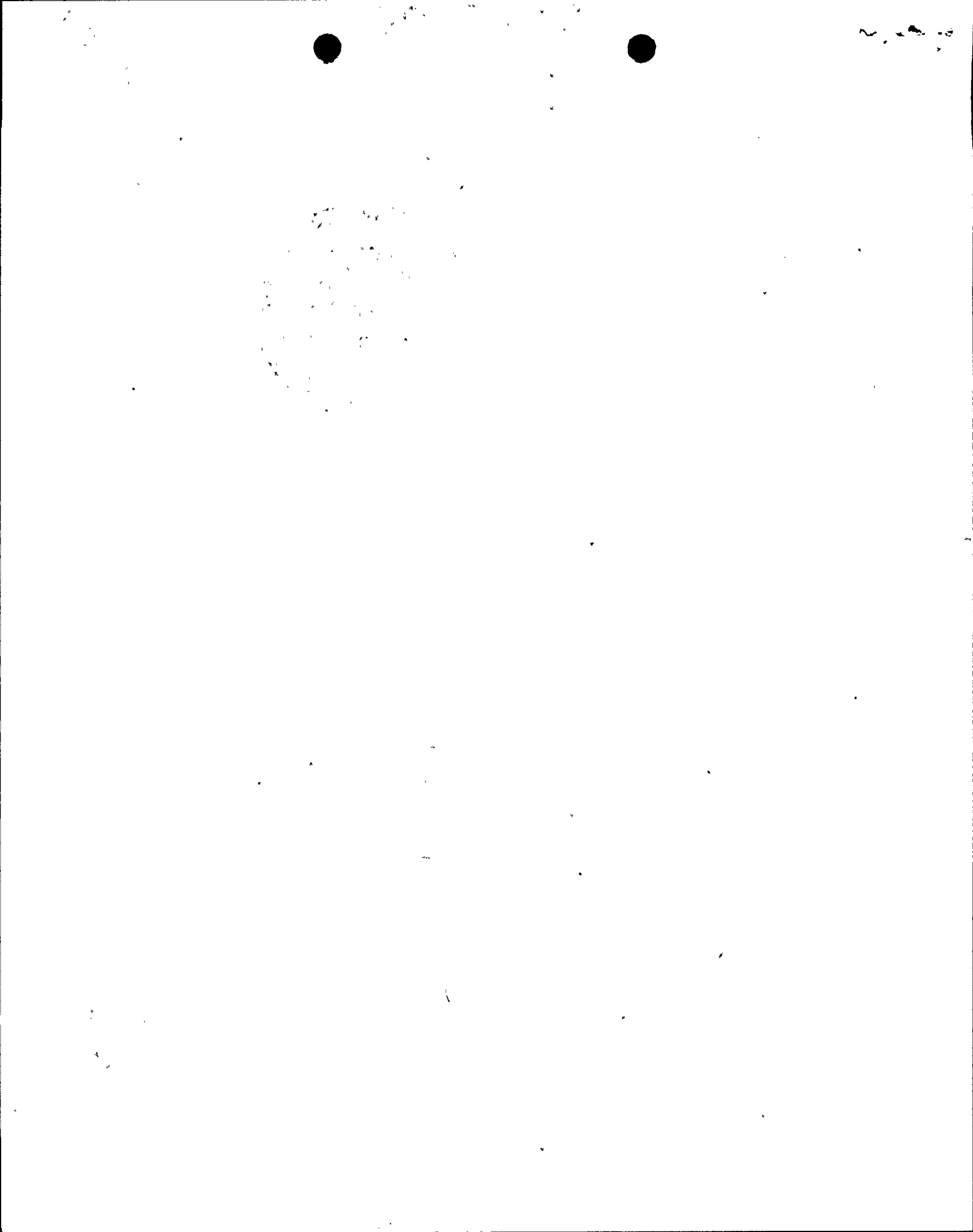
These two stations would cut California's electric costs & help cut our dependence on foreign oil by savings of millions of barrels of oil per year.

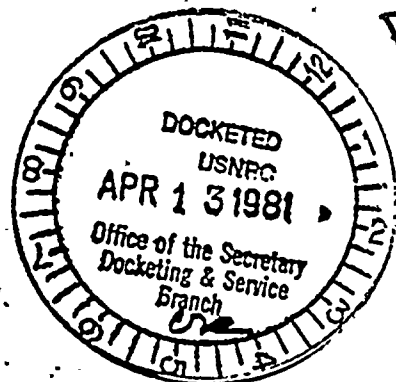
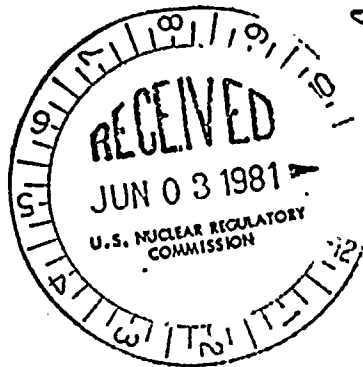
Dear Mr. Shearman,

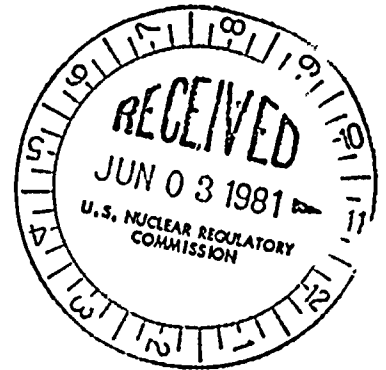

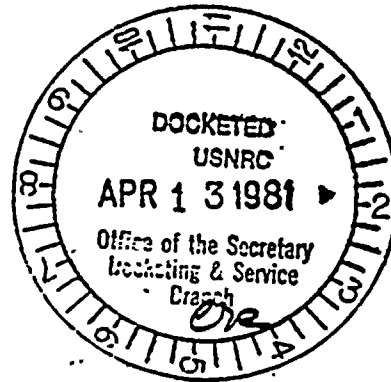

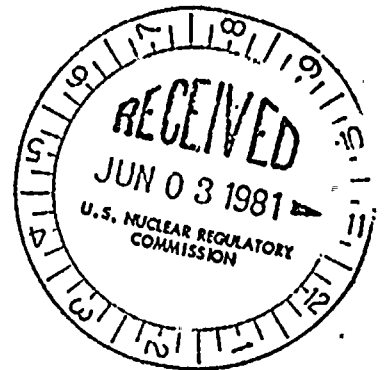
