
I remain concerned, however, that all safety questions should be resolved before a low-power testing license is granted.

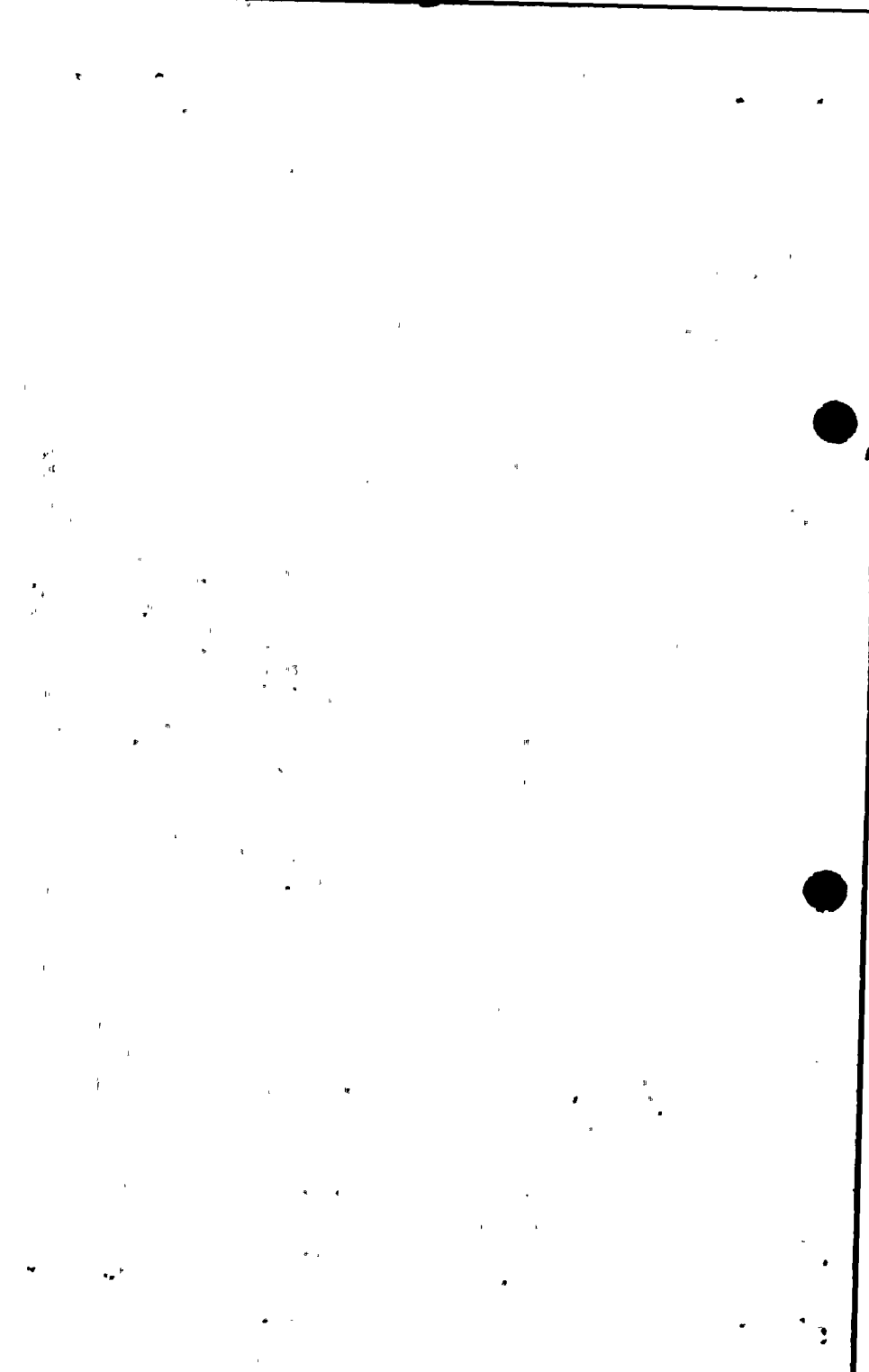


