To the Nuclear Regulatory Commission:

Waste Control Specialists (WCS) has applied to store tons of radioactive nuclear waste “temporarily” in Andrew County, TX.

WCS’s EIS doesn’t include all the risks involved in transporting nuclear waste by highway, rail or watercraft for the next 24 years. Routes chosen should consider potential hazards to communities, farms, sensitive natural land and bodies of water. After tentative routes have been determined, there should be a 90 day public comment period for those in the ‘danger zone.’

Also, the EIS doesn’t consider the risk of groundwater contamination in the vicinity of the dump site.

Additionally, the EIS doesn’t consider security at the proposed dump site and potential harm to the local area and community from potential acts of malice.

Most importantly, the local community has not consented to becoming a radioactive waste dump site. This community should not have to risk having its land, aquifers, plants, wildlife or livestock contaminated. Furthermore, there’s a significant probability that this site will become a permanent nuclear waste dump site.

WCS’s application for this location should be rejected.
