Dear Mr. Muller:

We have been informed that the Chumash Indian Village and cemetery site, Tsuhanu, vicinity of San Luis Obispo, California, properties that may be eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, may be affected by Pacific Gas and Electric Company's operation of its Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant. We have also been advised that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission may be involved in this undertaking through its licensing authority governing the nuclear plant's operation.

Please investigate this matter to determine whether your agency's involvement requires the comments of the Council pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 470f, as amended, 90 Stat. 1320). Steps to determine this responsibility are set forth in Section 800.4 of the Council's "Procedures for the Protection of Historic and Cultural Properties" (36 C.F.R. Part 800).
