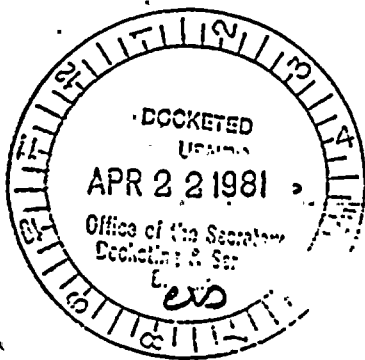
Dear Sir,

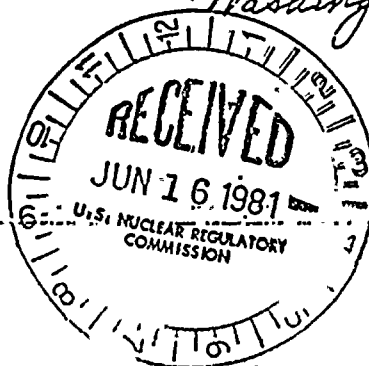

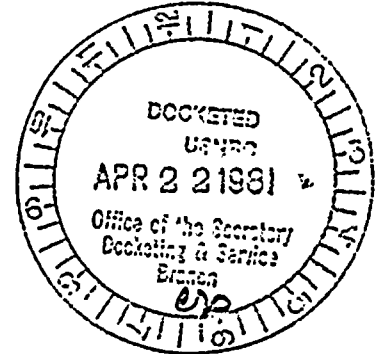

Dear Mr. Alhearne:

Since our country is so in need of energy, will you please consider a speedy licensing of the Diablo Canyon and San Onofre Nuclear plants in our state.

We here in California are paying millions of dollars in higher energy costs. The 2,000 megawatt Diablo Canyon of San Luis Obispo, which has been ready for over 5 years, could cut our electric costs by an estimated 80 million dollars per month if it was licensed and allowed to start operating. The Diablo plant could save 20 million barrels of foreign oil per year and replacement power costs now costing us 2 million dollars per day, plus half a million on interest charges.

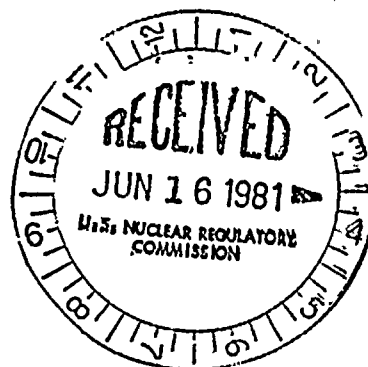
The San Onofre plant which is near San Clemente is already operating the 450 megawatt unit and has units 2 and 3 (each capable of 1100 megawatts) 90% complete. At full operating capacity, the San Onofre could save us 100,000 barrels of oil per day.

Please give the licensing of these nuclear plants your immediate consideration.

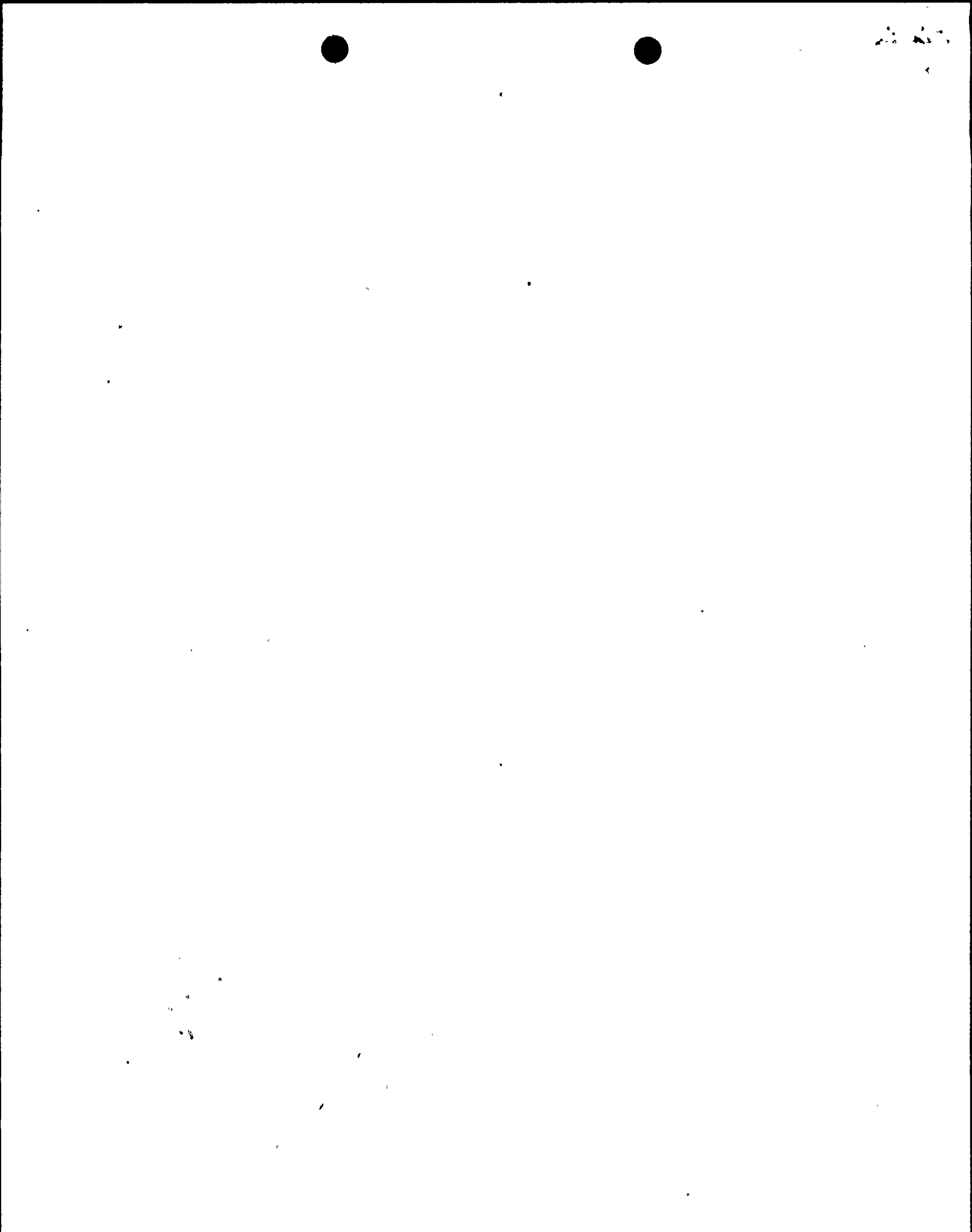

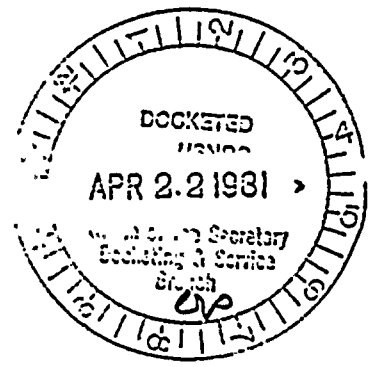

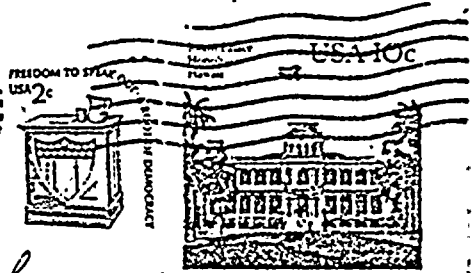

It's a crime that licenses are being withheld from by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission that are needed for the Diablo Canyon and San Onofre nuclear plants in California.

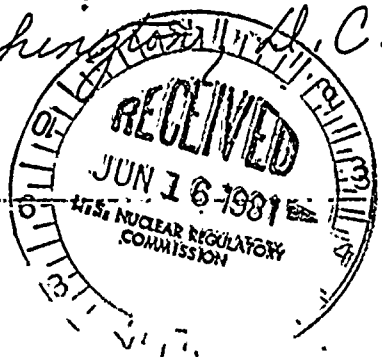
We would like to reduce the price of electricity which will happen with improved efficiency of nuclear power. Please help to get them their licenses immediately. Sincerely

Since our country is so in need of energy, won't you please consider a speedy licensing of the following plants in our state?

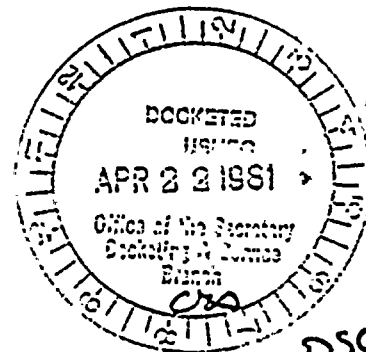
We in California are paying millions of dollars in higher energy costs. The 2,000 megawatt Diablo Canyon station at San Luis Obispo which has been ready for over 5 years, could cut our electric costs by an estimated \$80 million per month if it was licensed and allowed to start operating. The Diablo plant could save 20 million barrels of foreign oil per year and replacement power costs now costing us \$2 million dollars per day, plus a half a million on interest charges.

The San Onofre station near San Clemente, is already operating the 450 megawatt Unit 1 and 2 more units that are each capable of 1,100 megawatts that are almost completed and are waiting to be licensed. At full operating capacity, the San Onofre could save this state 100,000 barrels of oil per day.

Please give the licensing of these Nuclear plants your immediate consideration.
