	On March 10, 2017, the Office of Administration (ADM), with the support of the members of the agency's Rulemaking Coordinating Committee, deployed a centralized <u>rulemaking tracking and reporting tool</u> . The Web-based system provides internal and external stakeholders with consistent, accurate, and up-to-date information on all of the agency's planned rulemaking and petition for rulemaking (PRM) activities. NRC staff can access the tool from the agency's Intranet page, <u>drupal.nrc.goo</u> by selecting: Topics, Information Resources, Databases & Document Repositories, Planned Rulemaking Activities Database.				
	With the exception of budget data, all information from the system is presented to the public on the public Web site, and can be accessed by selecting "NRC Rules and Petitions" under the tab for "Public Meetings & Involvement" from the NRC Home page. Members of the public are able to search and filter on several key data fields, and download all rulemaking and PRM data in spreadsheet format.				
	The rulemaking and PRM information will be updated on a bi-weekly basis. Training for the NRC rulemaking project managers is scheduled for April 13, 2017, at the Professional Development Center. There will be a morning and an afternoon session.
