Enclosed is Amendment No. 24 to your NRC Material License No. 24-24817-01 in accordance with the April 12, 2017 letter (ML17018A411) from Jennifer L. Stewart, Corporate Counsel and Vice President of Human Resources, updating a letter dated January 13, 2017 and confirming the completion of a Transfer of Control previously reviewed and approved by our office. Please also note that we have updated Item Nos. 6.I., 8.G., 8.H., 8.X., and 8.Y. to reflect Amendment No. 22 to your license. Finally, we have updated Condition Nos. 10, 12, 14.A., 14.G., 15, and 16 to reflect the current NRC standard language for those conditions.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

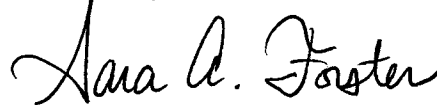
