Enclosed is Amendment No. 88 to your NRC Material License No. 21-00021-29 in accordance with your January 15, 2017, March 15, 2017, and March 16, 2017 requests. These documents may be found in our NRC Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at accession numbers ML17020A047, ML17079A519, and ML17097A268, respectively. Please also note that we have deleted Condition No. 17 in accordance with current NRC policy to include the reference to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations*, Part 71, "Packaging and Transportation of Radioactive Material," in the preamble, on page 1 of the license. We have added a new Condition No. 17 to include the NRC standard inventory condition and have broken Condition No. 19 into two conditions according to standard conditions. Finally, we have updated the license format and Condition Nos. 13 and 27. in accordance with current NRC licensing practice.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.


