Dear Mr. Tarver,

On behalf of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), I am responding to your March 31, 2017 letter to the Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act Officer, which the agency received on April 20, 2017. You appealed the agency's decision related to your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) request (FOIA/PA 2017-0346) which seeks a record showing why NRC took down the reactor/plant status listing on NRC website in early 2000s off the public website.

Specifically, you appealed the denial of information and adequacy of search.

Acting on your appeal, I have reviewed the record for this case and have determined that the NRC remains unable to locate any responsive records for this request. As stated in NRC form 464 Part I, dated March 22, 2017 and mailed to you in response to FOIA/PA 2017-0346, the NRC is unable to locate any emails responsive to your request. The agency did not find any additional communication. Therefore, I have denied your appeal.


This is the NRC's final decision concerning your appeal of the denial of information. As set forth in the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(a)(4)(B)), you may obtain judicial review of this decision in a district court of the United States in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of business. You may also seek judicial review in the district in which the agency's records are situated or in the District of Columbia.

As part of the 2007 FOIA amendments, the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) was created to offer mediation services to resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a nonexclusive alternative to litigation. In other words, using OGIS services does not affect your right to pursue litigation. If you are requesting access to your own records (which is considered a Privacy Act request), you should know that OGIS does not have the
