Because we changed over our documentation and license generation system last year, this amendment will be the first that your license will be issued in a new format. As a result of that change, I am checking all information in our database to be sure it is correct.

- Your license address currently lists "Columbia University, **Environmental & Occupational Health**, 419 West 199th Street, **Mail Code 2215**, New York, NY

10027. However, your letterhead says "Columbia University, **Environmental Health & Safety, Radiation Safety Program**, 419 W 119th Street, New York. NY 10027". Please let me know the correct department name to which mail should be addressed, and if a Mail Code should continue to be used.

- Your authorized location is on research vessels at sea; am I correct in assuming the sediment core samples are analyzed on board ship, then? If not, and you need temporary job sites anywhere the NRC has jurisdiction for land-based activities, you should provide a description of those activities in a formal letter.
