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Upon American Centrifuge Operating, LLC's (ACO) notification to the NRC of cessation of Lead Cascade operations and its intention to terminate the Lead Cascade Materials License following decontamination and decommissioning activities described in letter ACO 16-0010 dated March 02, 2016, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Portsmouth Gaseous Diffusion Plant Reservation site-wide impact was reviewed by the Shared Site Committee as required by the Gas Centrifuge Enrichment Plant (GCEP) Lease Exhibit L, USEC (predecessor to Centrus Energy Corp. (Centrus)) and DOE Resolution of Shared Site Issues at the Gaseous Diffusion Plants, Revision 2 (Shared Site Agreement). These discussions concluded that the de-lease of the X-1020, X-3000, XT-801 and X-112 facilities, which were designed as administrative offices and never used for radiological purposes, could be mutually beneficial to both Centrus and the DOE. Accordingly, Centrus submitted to the DOE notice of its intent to de-lease the aforementioned facilities, requesting DOE approval to do so before the expiration or termination of the GCEP Lease pursuant to Section 3.6(c) of the GCEP Lease. DOE subsequently approved this request resulting in the de-lease of the X-1020 and X-3000 on April 12, 2017 and the anticipated future de-lease of the XT-801 and X-112 facilities on November 1, 2017 and April 4, 2018, respectively.

Additionally, following Lead Cascade License termination (SNM-7003), ACO intends to maintain the American Centrifuge Plant License (SNM-2011).
