Subject: Zion Decommissioning & Site Rehabilitation Project – ongoing License Termination Plan Review Status / Public Meetings DPR-39 & DPR-48

Dear Mr. Hickman & Mr. Watson,

Thank you for the opportunity to be part of the Public Meetings related to the open items for the Zion Decommissioning & Site Rehabilitation License Termination DPR-39 & DPR-48

Pursuant to our narrative public comments and remarks at the last license termination meeting which you confirmed as noted, please be advised that we still note no comment from the licensee has been formulated regarding the following two items which were part and parcel to the original Zion project presentations made by the initial candidate licensee previous to 1st license and trust fund transfer:

- 1) Final landscaping plan and budget related to the real property lease termination of Zion Solutions LLC and the return to Exelon Generation LLC of the real property which will be categorized as having an unrestricted use post license termination. While the property is in private hands which is respected by the public the property is between two units of a large State Park with substantial public use and a substantial Lake Michigan frontage in Northeastern Illinois.
- 2) Removal of the Zion Plant's water supply pipe originally permitted for nuclear operations by social compact which extends substantially into Lake Michigan, the public space, and is part and parcel to the Zion Nuclear Facility and has to date been absent from the ongoing Decommissioning proceedings.

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
License Termination Meetings letter

The public has expressed previous reservations on these subject matters directly with the licensee, Zion Solutions LLC and additionally raised these same issues jointly and formally on the record at the initial NRC license termination meeting more than 2 years ago during NRC proceedings. Regrettably, these matters seem to be absent from thought trends and comments made by representatives of both the NRC and the licensee since who seem to be from the District of Columbia, UT and TN and seem to have little or no regard for local viewpoints on the matters.

Vista 360 would be pleased to address the details on these matters appropriately moving forward and as originally indicated respectfully request that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission take no final action on the License Termination Plan until such time as these important concluding matters are made crystal clear to the stakeholder public.
